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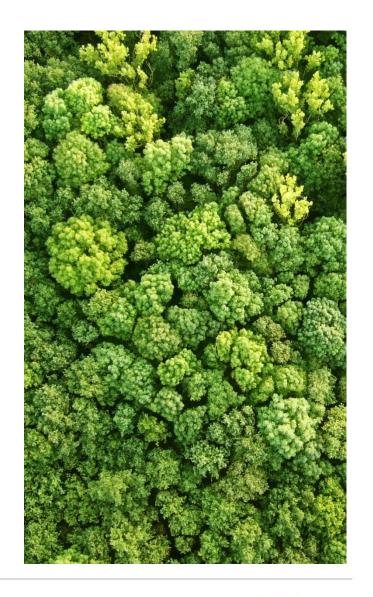

Objectives for Zambia's SIS

- First priority: demonstrate that Cancun safeguards have been addressed and respected (UNFCCC requirement)
- Supply information for adaptive management of REDD+ to improve social and environmental outcomes
- Inform improvements in PLR framework and its implementation
- Strengthen existing information systems
- Support implementation and reporting processes of international conventions







A step-wise approach

UNFCCC encourages countries to design SIS in a way that "allows for improvements over time"

SIS design document foresees two stages of SIS development:

- SIS v1.0 (2017-2020): basic information structure and initial compilation of content, focusing on how safeguards are 'addressed'; preparation of methods to close gaps in coverage
- Other SIS iterations (2020 and beyond): including additional information categories, especially on how safeguards are 'respected' (i.e. actual implementation practice and outcomes)







Why update the document?

First draft of SIS design document completed **in April 2017**; focus of **information structure** on existing PLRs and their implementation; however, only preliminary, **non-exhaustive PLR review** available.

New inputs available as of end 2017:

- List of proposed REDD+ actions from REDD+ Investment Plan;
- Benefits and risks analysis of proposed REDD+ actions
- Draft national interpretation of Cancun safeguards
- → Opportunity to improve identification of information needs (incl. possible indicators) and reduce reliance on (incomplete) PLR information





Proposed new content – information template (1)

Increased focus on **key concerns for each safeguard**, as identified in **national interpretation** – making it clearer what information is needed

Information on existing PLRs complemented by **information on REDD+-specific safeguards measures** (to increase their visibility, and because this information is more readily available)

Simplified structure: numbered list of information categories, smaller, more concise tables





Proposed new content – information template (2)

Information categories:

- Text of the safeguard
- 2. Draft national interpretation
- 3. Potential benefits of REDD+ actions related to the safeguard
- 4. Potential risks of REDD+ actions related to the safeguard
- 5. ...





Proposed new content – information template (3)

Information categories:

- 5. How the safeguard is addressed
 - 1. Tabular overview
 - 2. Narrative description (including figures and references)
 - 3. Indicators (optional)
- 6. How the safeguard is respected in the way REDD+ actions are implemented
 - 1. Tabular overview
 - 2. Narrative description (including figures and references)
 - 3. Indicators (recommended)
- 7. ...

Information categories:

 - 1. Tabular overview
 - 2. Narrative description (including figures and references)
 - 3. Indicators (recommended)







Proposed new content – information template (5)

Overview tables: 5.1 addressing safeguards

Key concern (from national interpret- ation)	Provisions in existing PLRs	REDD+- specific safeguard measures	Measures taken to strengthen implement- ation	Remaining gaps	Plans to improve safeguards application / address gaps







Proposed new content – information template (6)

Overview tables: 6.1 respecting safeguards (process)

Key concern (from national interpretation)	Practice of REDD+ implementation	Areas for improvement





Proposed new content – information template (7)

Overview tables: 7.1 respecting safeguards (outcomes)

Key concern (from national interpretation)	Outcomes of REDD+ implementation	Opportunities to improve outcomes





Proposed new content – recommendations

2017-2020:

- 1. Use **draft national interpretation** as primary basis for specifying **information needs**
- Immediate focus in populating SIS should be on Type I information (how safeguards are addressed)
- 3. In parallel with compiling type I information, start to clarify approaches for developing Type II and III information (how safeguards are respected).
- 4. Once options for Type II and III information have been assessed, set priorities for information to be included in SIS versions 1.0 and 1.1.







Proposed new content – recommendations

2020 and beyond:

1. Revise the design of SIS v1.0 to incorporate lessons learned and close gaps in information coverage, leading to a fully operational SIS v1.1 that meets all objectives identified for Zambia's SIS.
