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




RECOFTC background

Our vision and mission


<u>Vision</u>

Project background

- Millions of forest dependent people key players for forest-based climate change mitigation efforts
- Low level of knowledge and awareness on climate change and REDD+
- Grassroots perspective on REDD+ is still not well represented



Project goal

Grassroots stakeholders in Asia are enabled to effectively contribute to the REDD+ planning and policy process, communicate their perspective to policy makers, and thus are well positioned to potentially benefit from REDD+ for local socio-economic development



Project outcomes

OC 1: Grassroots stakeholders use new knowledge on REDD+ and associated social safeguards and adapt it in the context of sustainable forest management in project countries



REDD+ capacity development

- 1,000 capacity development events organized
- 50,000 stakeholders learned about REDD+ and climate change
- 40% women

Lessons learned - Communication

- Messaging: 1-way unclear & conflicting messaging can raise expectations/exacerbate misunderstanding, including on benefit sharing
 2-way (dialogue) can help address
- Communication tool development:
 Different tools for different audiences –
 products, events, supporting
 dialogue/reflection
- Don't overemphasize publications
- Translations planning & time





Lessons learned – Communication

Dissemination approaches:

Who are the 'messengers' & what is their capacity, technical & in communication

Participation/dialogue/reflection - communication by & for stakeholders





Lessons learned – Communication

Some ingredients of effective communication:

Communication is part of the project proposal and plan from the beginning

Participatory approaches stakeholders in all stages

Communication officers involved not only in communication tool production
