


Functions of a NFMS











UN-REDD Hanoi Workshop objectives







Main Results: better understanding of a NFMS and RL for REDD+; Greater national capacity in design / implementation of NFMS, RELs/RLs.

Key Objectives:

- Improve understanding of key components and approaches of an NFMS for REDD+ and share experiences between countries;
- Update on UNFCCC guidance to develop a national REL or forest RL
- Share approaches and examples that countries may find useful from demonstration activities/initiatives submitted to UNFCCC;
- Provide opportunity for information exchange and joint learning across countries in the Asia-Pacific region on NFMS and RELs.
- Identify capacity gaps in NFMS and RELs development to help plan follow-up activities for support at regional and national levels.
