#### UN-REDD is.....









- The United Nations Collaborative Programme on <u>Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest</u> <u>Degradation in Developing Countries</u>
- Joint FAO, UNDP, UNEP effort > 2008 (relatively young)
- UN-REDD aims to help countries get "ready for REDD+"
- FAO focus: Forest Monitoring (MRV) and Governance
- US\$150m from Norway, Denmark, Spain, Japan, (EU and Luxembourg pledged), \$24 m /yr 2013-14
