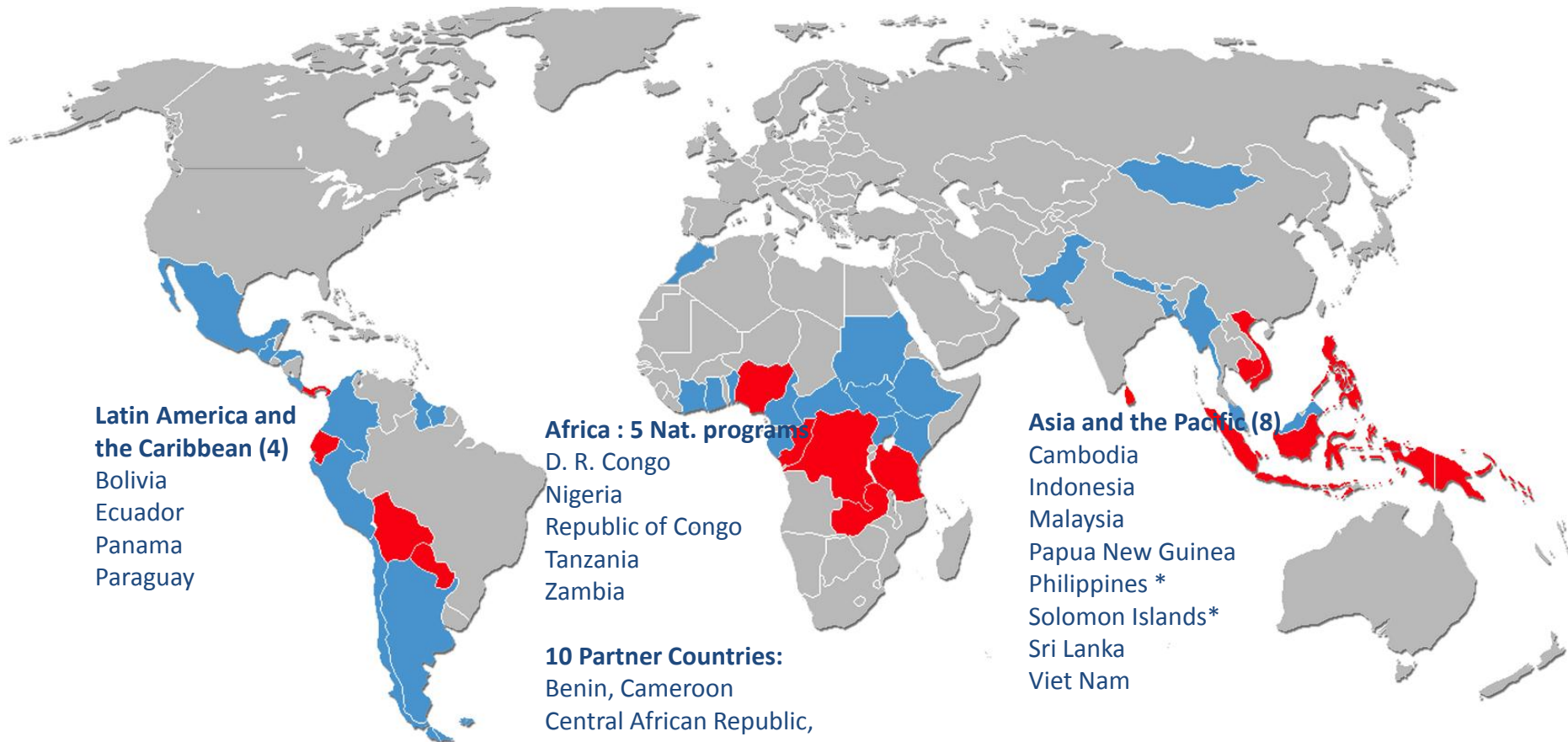

- The United Nations Collaborative Programme on Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation in Developing Countries
- Joint FAO, UNDP, UNEP effort > 2008 (relatively young)
- UN-REDD aims to help countries get “ready for REDD+”
- FAO focus: Forest Monitoring (MRV) and Governance
- US\$150m from Norway, Denmark, Spain, Japan, (EU and Luxembourg pledged), \$24 m /yr 2013-14

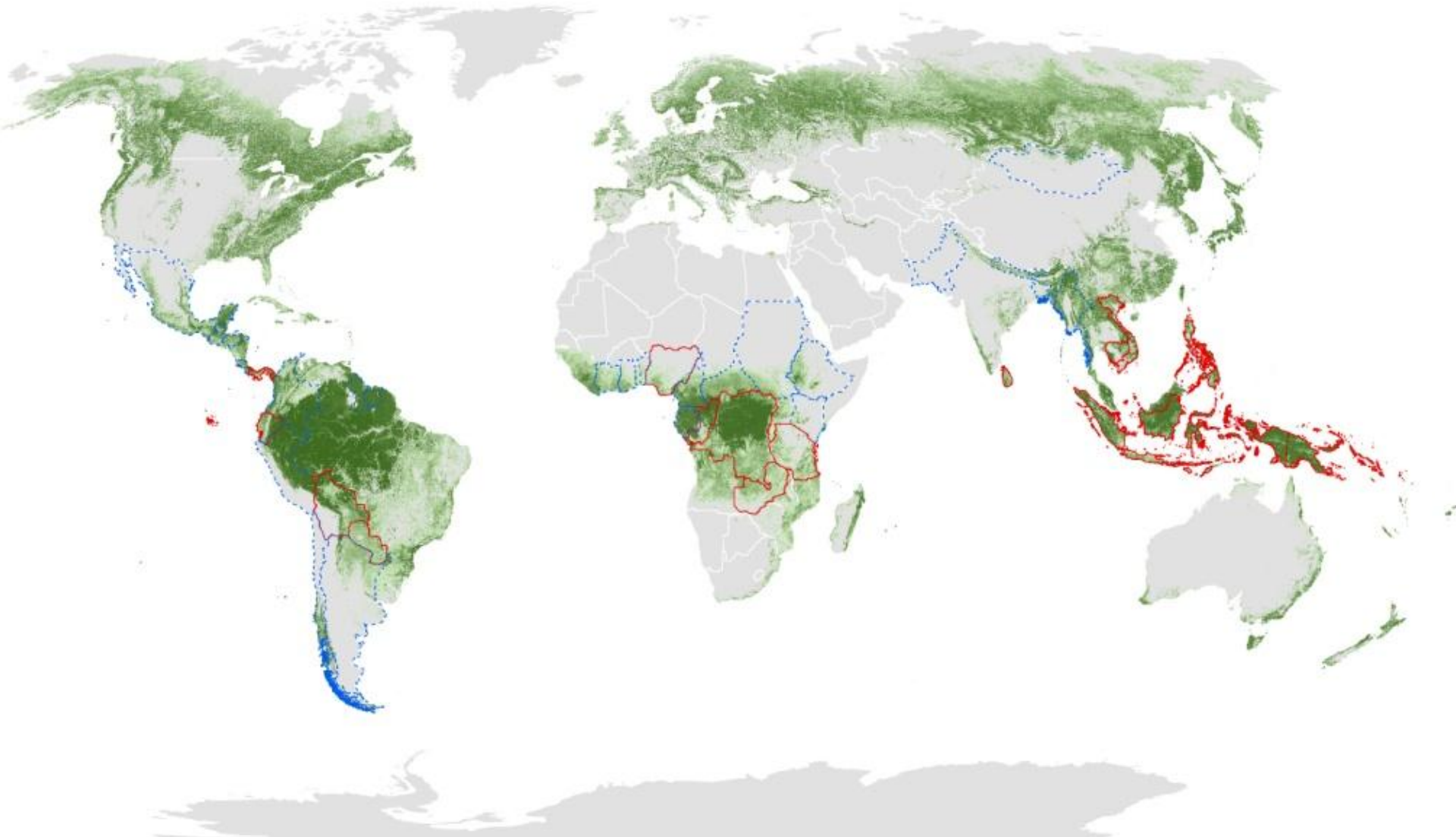

Support to 48 countries –
over half the worlds tropical forest



1. Build consistency in understanding National Forest Monitoring Systems (NFMS) for REDD+ & how this supports national REDD+ Readiness activities
2. Provide an overview of the purposes, practices and benefits, of monitoring forests for REDD+ and for traditional national forest inventory
3. Information exchange & joint learning across countries in the Asia-Pacific region on NFMS for REDD+
4. Identify capacity gaps in NFMS development and plan follow-up activities for support at regional and national levels.



Day 1: Introductions and presentations on NFMS for REDD+ MRV

Day 2: Break into 4 sub-groups in parallel sessions:

- 1) Monitoring forests using satellite images
- 2) National Forest Inventories
- 3) Greenhouse Gas Inventory: Reporting requirements for forests
- 4) Collection of other information in NFI's including socio-economic and biodiversity data, consultation and safeguards

Day 3: NFMS planning and future activities

- Introduction to NFMS Action Plans and national experiences
- Identification of capacity building needs / priorities for NFMS for REDD +
- Future plans for regional NFMS capacity building activities
