Relevance of the PGA for REDD+

PGA = generating information on governance issues relevant to REDD+, through an inclusive & participative process

- Feeding into national information systems on REDD+ safeguards
- Providing capacity building to ensure that:
 - o relevant and timely information is provided
 - o civil society actors act upon the information provided



Implementation of the PGA pilots

Identifying and convening relevant stakeholders and participants

Defining the scope – prioritizing areas of concentration

 Analysis of governance structures and systems; input to recommending policy reform

Training and capacity building





Added value of the PGAs

Relevant information:

providing information that is in demand by the stakeholders

Ownership:

to follow up recommendations and to act upon the information

Sustainability:

continued information sharing and follow up





Activities for 2012-2013

 Continue supporting existing 4 pilot countries (Ecuador, Indonesia, Nigeria, Vietnam)

 Develop guidance on how to undertake a PGA for REDD+, based on lessons learnt

 Explore potential new pilots (subject to available funding + selection criteria)
