Brief summary:

The workshop and subsequent expert meeting were initial activities in the work of the Japan REDD+ Safeguard Research Project Consortium. The former was attended by over 100 researchers, government officials and others, and the latter by about 35. The discussions were wide-ranging, covering national and international scale poliy advances in relations to safeguards, project scale experience with REDD+ type actions and experience of community engagement in both projects and forest assessment and monitoring. The presentation I gave was well-received and it was subsequently requested that the same presentation be included in a side-event to hosted by Japan at the UNFCCC CoP in Warsaw. No specific decisions on the direction for the Research Project Consortium were made or announced during the meetings, but the inputs of the participants in both events were warmly welcomed as a basis for further discussion that would direct the Consortium's activities. It is worth watching for the likely valuable results of this work.

In subsequent meetings with JIICA and ITTO, I introduced examples of UNEP-WCMC's work within UN-REDD on supporting countries in addressing safeguards and multiple benefits, and discussed the potential for future collaboration. In both cases there was considerable interest in work to mobilise experience and knowledge from project-scale activities in forms that made them both accessible and relevant for informing both policy and other

on-the-ground activities. From ITTO in particular, there was interest in pursuing joint efforts in capturing and structuring existing experience in ways that might highlight its relevance to safeguards and other aspects of REDD+. ITTO also expressed interest in drawing on available economic and other expertise in a forthcoming workshop on PES.
