BACKGROUND


•The history of Sokoine University of Agriculture dates back to 1965 when it started as an Agricultural College

2.0 UNIVERSITY ACADEMIC UNITS


SUA has four Faculties namely;

•Miombo woodlands in Kitulanghalo in Morogoro region (500 ha).

6.0 FACULTY OF FORESTRY AND NATURE


