## Beyond forests, sustaining life and livelihood in a greener Sri Lanka

How REDD+ will contribute to improving sustainable land management to maximize environmental services, conserve biodiversity maintain economic growth and minimize risks of natural disasters through a stepwise, decentralized and nested approach.

Scale: National scale with sub national interventions

### Priority drivers selected: 4 main drivers:

- Infrastructure development projects
- Large scale agriculture ventures
- Illegal occupation of forested lands
- Multiple localized degradation drivers

#### 4. IDENTIFICATION AND SELECTION OF PAMS

Have you designed a preliminary set of PAMs for REDD+? (Yes)

As our list of candidate PAMs is very long... we attach it in a different document.

#### How were these PAMs identified?

- Preliminary PAMs from the Drivers study
- · Need to update that list
- 2 day workshop with 30 stakeholders on PAMs listing (from the 4 drivers, development of problem and solution trees)
- Prioritization process ongoing (using a Multi Criteria Analysis)

#### 5. IMPLEMENTATION FRAMEWORK FOR REDD+ IMPLEMENTATION

Have you designed an implementation framework for your NS/AP? (No)

- Still under discussion;
- Need to wait for more clarity in the prioritized PAMs to better understand the Sri Lanka REDD+;
- Will come directly after the prioritization process (in parallel to the Public Fund Management study).

# **KEY CHALLENGES**

- <u>Country leadership</u> without a high political buying/support/ownership, REDD+ cannot work in a country. What are the lessons learned, good practices, experiences, advices that a country like Sri Lanka can benefit to ensure this crucial support? In other words, how shall we approach the higher political level? How do we sell REDD+ to a President? REDD+ costs and benefits?
- <u>Full stakeholder participation in the Strategy development</u> without a broad stakeholder involvement in its preparation, there is a risk that a REDD+ strategy won't be approved or followed. What are the lessons learned, good practices, experiences, advices that a country like Sri Lanka can benefit on this point? How can we keep the momentum of the stakeholders without giving them any direct benefits? How to acknowledge and value their participation?
- <u>Fundraising</u> without clear financial commitments, our REDD+ strategy will never be implemented. What are the lessons learned, good practices, experiences, advices that a country like Sri Lanka can benefit from more advanced countries? How do you promote your REDD+ strategy to international donors/funds? What are the tendencies (requirements, potential) regarding bilateral agreements? What can we do for more visibility on our REDD+ Strategy?
- PAMs monitoring is there any work done so far on monitoring of PAMs?
- Better understanding of the links between FREL and REDD+ Strategy how the FREL impact the Strategy?

## **LESSONS LEARNED**

- The succession/order of activities is very important;
- REDD+ roadmap/strategy development is country specific;
- Seek for political support should be a priority starting from the beginning of the readiness phase.
