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




REDD+ is an urgent climate solution

deforestation contributes ~16% of annual GHG emissions

REDD+ offers nearly 1/3 of technologically available, cost-effective mitigation options by 2020 Abatement potential GtCO₂e per year, 2020







 ~\$100 million private voluntary investment in forest carbon (2007 – 2009)









 Voluntary Transactions Growing modestly...








significant supply constraints

- non-conformity of REDD+ asset class
- nascent institutions, uncertain governance
- limited evidence of sound REDD+ projects

= high risk, low investor

actual land cover 2005




deforestation likelihood


