The Enabling Environment




- Mainstream the sustainable development principles into national and sub-national policy-making processes
- Elaborate the inter-linkages of development issues to ensure comprehensive policy mix of different sectoral policies (e.g. poverty and human rights, poverty and environment sustainability, poverty and health services etc)
- ➤ It should be synchronized with the medium and long-term development plans to provide actionable policies and programs with specific targets and indicators.
- Conduct education and socialization supported by consistent national campaign
- Facilitate, consultation and dialogue for multi-stakeholder commitment and participation (Business, CSO, Academic)

Good Governance, competence resources and political will



- Good governance is a critical enabling factor.
- Good governance principles should be promoted as fundamental values that guide our efforts to execute i.e. transparency, accountability, responsiveness, serving attitude, ethical, participatory, equitable and inclusiveness
- Develop competence to achieve excellence in public services by deploying skilled resources and sustainable technology
- Establish national-wide data bank to ensure data consistency and integrity (policy making, research, development)
- Strong **political will** to eradicate corruption, law enforcement, access to justice, effective public policies, just spatial management, conducive business climate, friendly environment and social inclusion.
