# The UN-REDD Global Programme

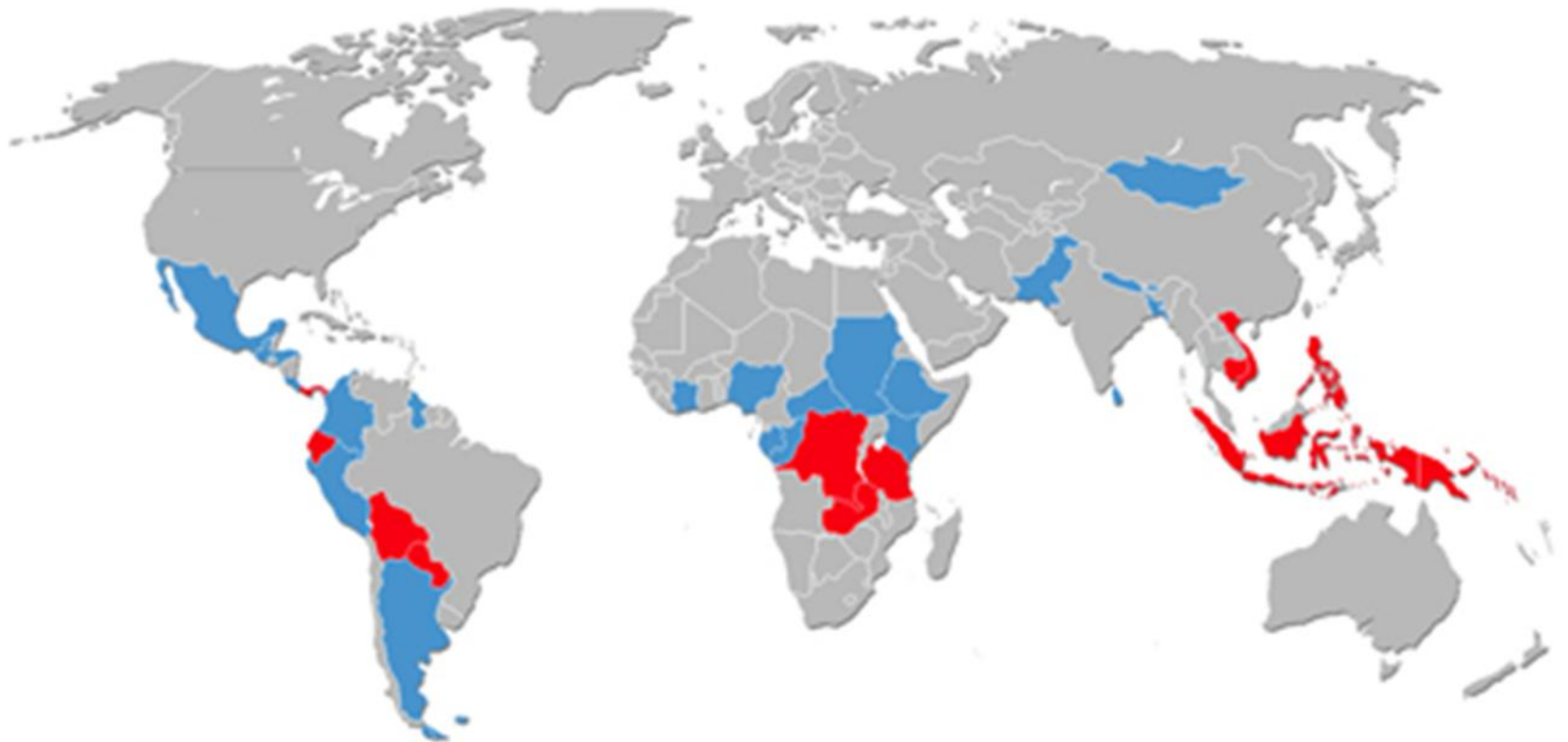

- To help countries and the international community gain experience with REDD, and to contribute to the UNFCCC process
- Coordination with other initiatives, e.g. FCPF, FIP, UNFCCC

# The UN-REDD Global Programme

The UN-REDD Global Programme work is divided in the following seven work areas:

- Measurement, reporting and verification (MRV) and monitoring
- Engagement of Indigenous Peoples, civil society and other stakeholders
- Multiple benefits
- Knowledge management, coordination and communication
- National REDD+ governance
- Equitable benefit sharing systems
- Sectoral transformation



# Global REDD activities in Tanzania

- MRV coordination meeting in Dar Es Salaam, 2-5 February 2010
- Regional workshop “Opportunity costs of REDD+” in Arusha, 22-25 November 2010,
  - Cooperation between FCPF/WBI/ICRAF/UNREDD
  - 9 African countries
- Regional workshop on development of guidelines for “Free Prior and Informed Consent and Recourse Mechanism” in Arusha, 24-27 January 2011
- Regional Course on REDD+ MRV, NFI and Monitoring in Morogoro, 11-15 July 2011
- Training workshop on REDD+ safeguards to be held by FCPF/UNREDD/Care in September 2011



# UN-REDD Tanzania - implementation arrangements

- Implementation period: 10/2009 – 06/2012
- Programme Advisory Group (PAG) to provide programme oversight, advice and support
- Programme Coordination & Management Group (PCMG) to manage implementation
- Mid-term evaluation is planned to review progress of the current programme and facilitate planning beyond current implementation period.

# UN-REDD Tanzania Outcomes


**Outcome 1:** National governance framework and institutional capacities strengthened for REDD

**Outcome 3:** Improved capacities to manage REDD and provide other forest ecosystem services at district and local levels

# Outcome 1: National governance framework and institutional capacities strengthened for REDD

- Training and capacity development on REDD+
  - Training held in Feb/March 2011 for 100 participants
  - Training manual prepared
  - Strategic advice for MNRT on training and capacity development needs prepared
  - ToRs have been prepared for a capacity needs assessment for REDD+ of government institutions at all levels
- Estimating the cost of REDD+
  - Regional workshop on “Opportunity costs of REDD+” in Arusha, 22-25 November.
  - RfP/ToRs advertised on 23 May 2011 for “Estimating cost elements of REDD+”
    - Opportunity cost, implementation cost, transaction cost and institutional cost.



# Outcome 1: National governance framework and institutional capacities strengthened for REDD

- Contributions to development of a National REDD+ Strategy:
  - Legal issues on REDD+ and carbon.
  - Support consultations with local communities on REDD+.
  - Develop showcasing materials for marketing REDD+.
  - Review provisions of the Forest Act with regards to REDD+.
  - Support SESA and other safeguard approaches.



## Outcome 2: Increased capacity for capturing REDD elements within national Monitoring, Assessment, Reporting and Verification Systems

- Develop a system for REDD information synthesis and sharing established at FBD and linked to NAFOBEDA.
- Assessment of forest degradation
  - A concept note has been prepared.
- Soil carbon measurement and analysis under preparation.
- National maps on carbon and co-benefits to be prepared to inform delivery of the REDD Framework.
- Capacity development for mapping at MNRT.



## Outcome 3: Improved capacity to manage REDD and provide other forest ecosystem services at district and local levels

- Consultancy advertised by MNRT on 'Assessment of how REDD management could fit into District and Village Land Use planning'
- Activities are planned on the following, in close cooperation with REDD+ pilot projects in Tanzania:
  - Testing implementing mechanisms for REDD+;
  - Testing payment distribution options for REDD+;
  - Options for bundling REDD+ payments with existing PES schemes for non-carbon services (water, biodiversity, adaptation);
  - Options for combining REDD+ finance with other sources of carbon markets (CDM, adaptation).



## Outcome 4: Broad based stakeholder support for REDD in Tanzania

- A consultancy to support MNRT's EPU with the development of training and awareness raising measures for REDD+ is being prepared.
- ToRs are under preparation for a consultancy to collect local peoples perspectives on the potential for REDD and the likely benefits, costs and challenges.
- Measures to provide targeted messages on the potential for REDD to communities.

# Programme Coordination & Management Group (PCMG)

- Members from MNRT/FBD, VPO, UNDP, FAO, UNEP
- Mandates:
  - agreeing on quarterly and annual work plans,
  - reviewing/agreeing on substantial financial re-allocations and budget revisions;
  - reviewing progress made in implementing work plans, achieving outputs and fulfilling outcomes and indicators,
  - ensuring operational co-ordination among UNDP, FAO and UNEP staff, and between UN organizations and the Project Team;
  - addressing management and implementation problems;
  - identifying emerging strategic issues and problems to be taken to the PAG;
  - reviewing and responding to substantive developments in the REDD 'environment' at national level;
  - reviewing financial procedures and provide recommendations to PAG;
  - liaison with UN Agencies' UN-REDD teams and National REDD Task Force;
  - Identifying emerging lessons learned and communicating
