Context and objectives

This half day training is specifically dedicated to developing the capacity of civil society on risks and risk mitigation measures against corruption in REDD+.

The goals of this half day session are to :

- Introduce and discuss the approach in the TI Manual on “Improving Integrity in the development and Implementation of Forest Carbon Projects and National REDD+ Strategies”
- Increase networking opportunities and connectivity between REDD+ NGOs and anti-corruption NGOs
- Raise awareness about, and explore opportunities for partnerships on REDD+ anti-corruption measures to be supported by UNDP on behalf of the UN-REDD Programme
- Create space for regional networks and information exchange
- Identify capacity needs for civil society (what tools/support is needed now/ in the medium term?)
