Concept Note Development of a Consultation and Participation Plan

1. Background¹


The Cambodia REDD+ Readiness process recognizes the critical role that different stakeholders have in developing effective, efficient and equitable approaches to REDD+. The Cambodia REDD+ Roadmap is committed to the development of a multi-stakeholder REDD+ Readiness process that is inclusive and balanced between different stakeholder groups. The programme has two objectives for consultation and participation:

Objectives:-

- Stakeholders are empowered to engage in the National REDD+ Process through the development of Strategies and methods of implementation and the review of proposed policies
- Stakeholders have access to information on REDD+ and the Cambodia REDD+ Readiness Process

To achieve these objectives a three phase and multi-layered approach has been developed (Figure 1).

Figure 1: A Three phase and multi-layered approach that has been developed to achieve the objectives for consultation and participation



This consultation and participation planning process will be guided by **nine principles and corresponding criteria** (table 1) and supported by a **eight step consultation and participation planning tool** (table 2);

the planning tool is based on joint guidelines on Stakeholder engagement provided by UN-REDD and FCPF² and the lessons learned from stakeholder engagement laid out in the REDD+ Roadmap.

The key objective of the next phase in Consultation and Participation is: To develop the framework for information flow and feedback mechanism and design an initial work plan to test the aforesaid framework.
