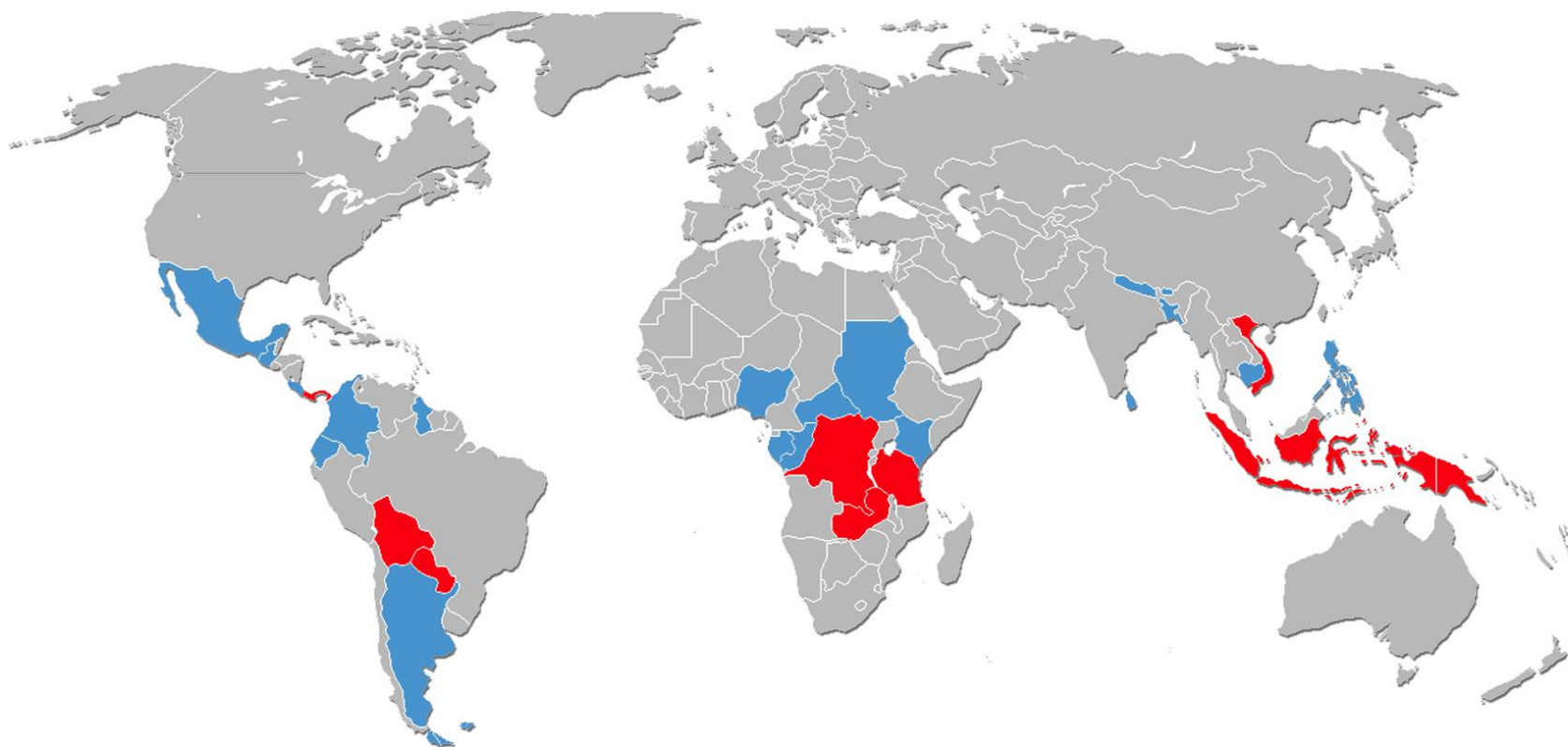

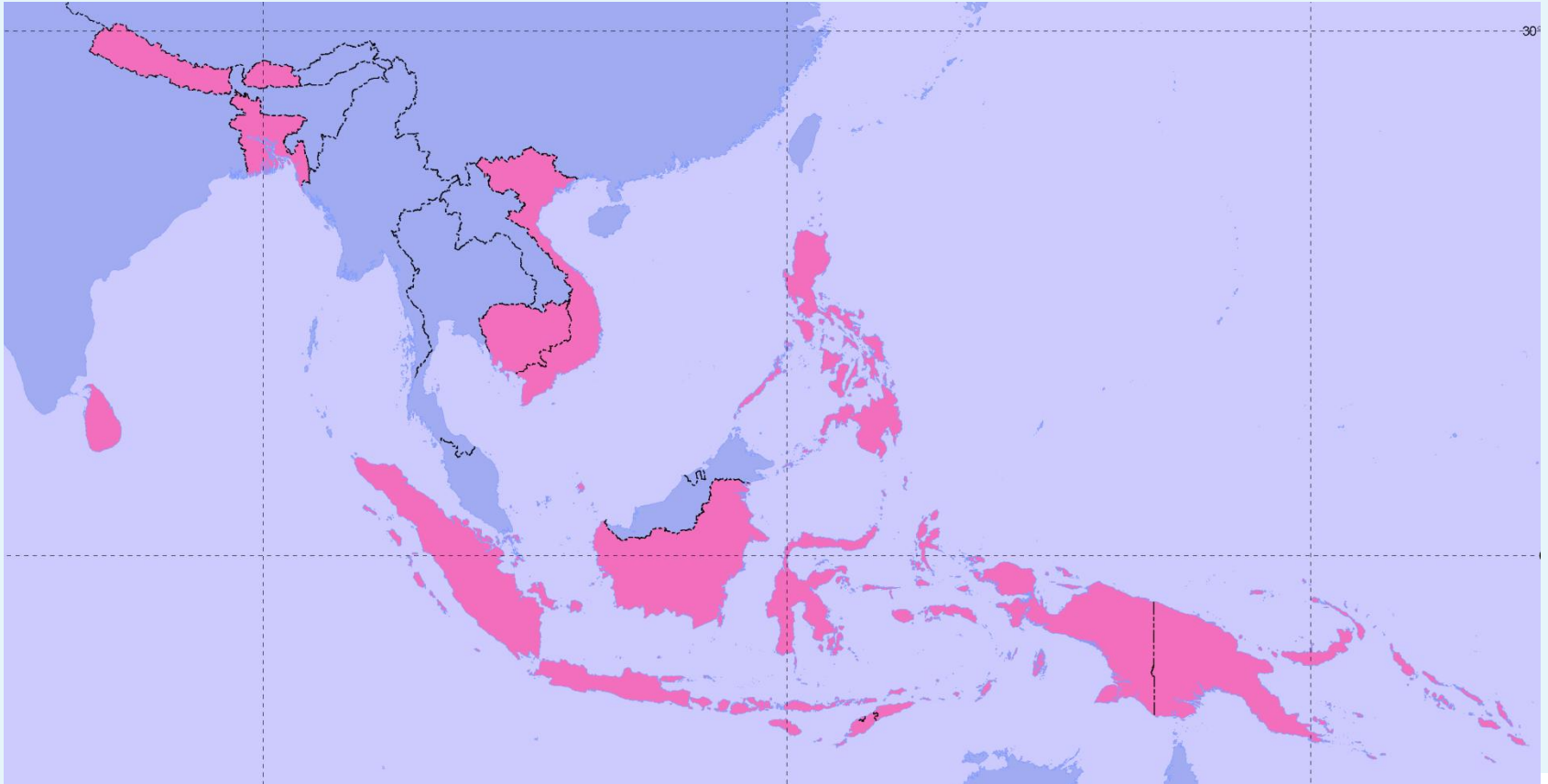
UN-REDD : Pilot and Partner Countries

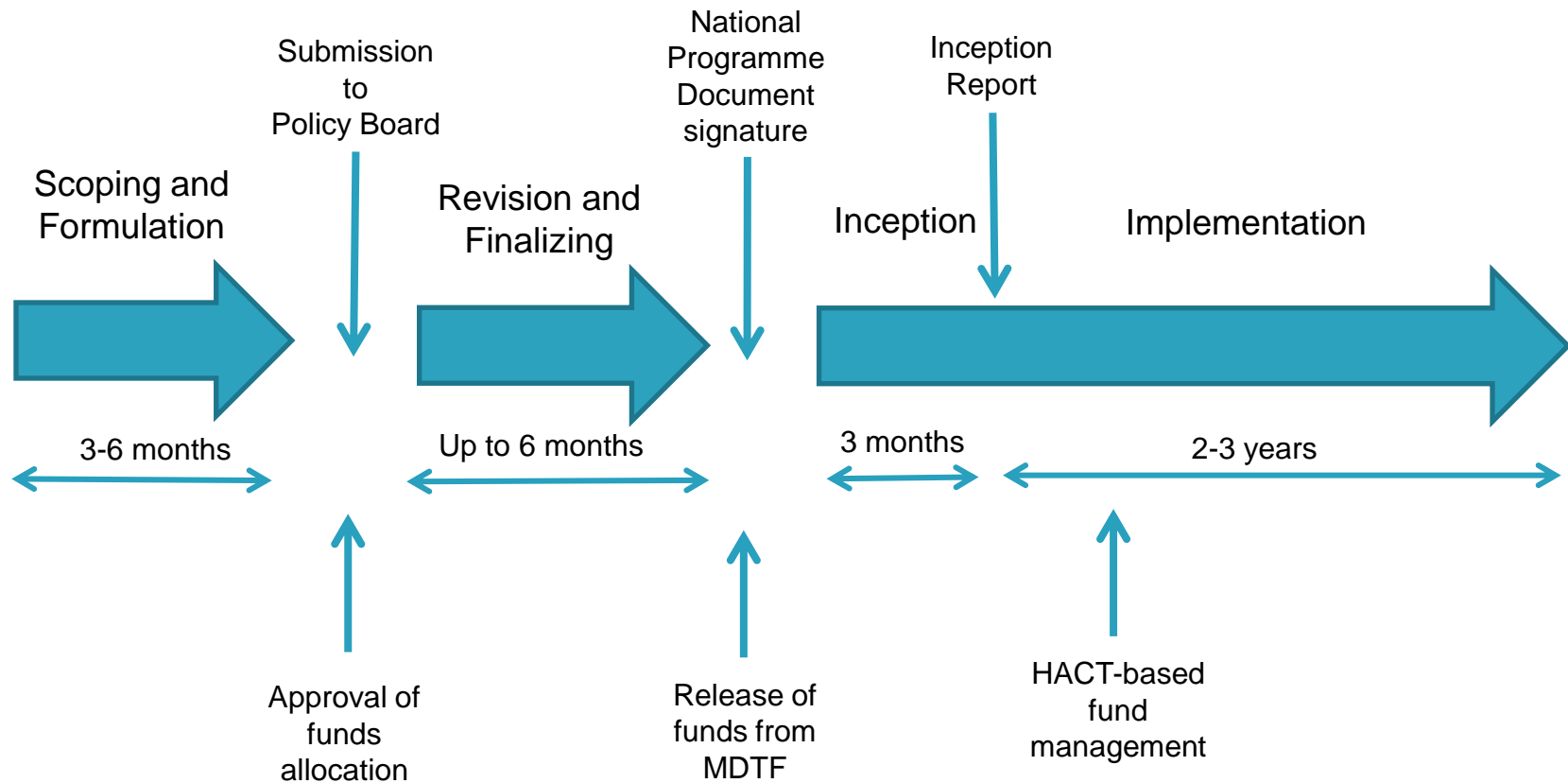

What is a UN-REDD Country?

- Different terms used:
 - Quick Start Pilot
 - Full member of the Policy Board
 - Alternate member of the Policy Board
 - Observer of the Policy Board
 - Regional groupings
 - Rotational representation
 - Tier 2
- UN-REDD Strategy 2011-2014
 - Up to additional 20 “initial readiness” countries
 - Up to 40 “targeted support” countries




National Programmes: 2011 and beyond

- Ecuador & Nigeria are invited to submit NPs by PB6 (March 2011), but then no more exceptions
- Selection criteria to be used for prioritizing funding for new national programmes
- Working Group to develop criteria by P6:
 - Countries – Argentina and Zambia
 - Donors – Denmark
 - Civil Society – Global Witness
 - Indigenous Peoples – IP-Africa
 - UN Agencies – UNDP
- Secretariat to provide analysis of review criteria used for similar purposes in other processes



Multiple Delivery Partners

- UN-REDD Agencies (FAO, UNDP, UNEP) could manage World Bank R-PP grants
- Pilot phase approved by the FCPF – 5 pilot countries
- Cambodia and Panama have expressed their interest
- Other 3 pilots to be determined by 17th Nov taking into account :
 - Situations where other delivery partners are more effective than the World Bank to deliver REDD+ services to the relevant country, with priority being given to countries in which the World Bank has no presence
 - Requests and needs of the country
 - Maximization of learning

- Joint Readiness Template
- Guidance Note on Stakeholder Engagement
- “Common Approach” on social and environmental principles
 - Task Force to develop, under the FCPF’s ‘multiple delivery partners’ agenda
- And also coordination with FIP.....GEF.....bilaterals
