
What is REDD+? Definition:

Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation; and the role of conservation, sustainable management of forests and enhancement of forest carbon stocks


+ = conservation, SFM and enhancement of stocks



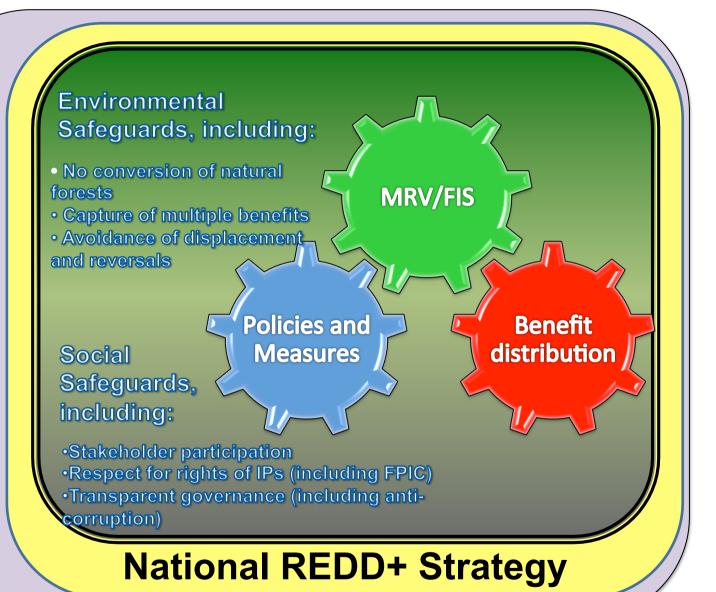




Timeline for REDD+ in Bangladesh





Challenges of REDD+ in Bangladesh


- Managing expectations
- Building community trust
- Cross-sectoral and multi-level coordination
- Capacity building for all REDD+ stakeholders
- Forest legislation and enforcement
- Clarifying rights to benefit
- Credible forest monitoring
- Tree cover on non-forest land
- Ensuring local community participation





Opportunities for REDD+ in Bangladesh

- Implementation of the sixth five-year plan following BCCSAP Pillar 5
- Mobilising BCCRF and BCCTF
- Build on the wide LGD extension network
- Strong civil society institutions
- Experience of IPAC and Chunati WS
- Government social forestry programme
- Programming framework in CHT (CHTDF)
- Regional and international knowledge networks







Potential Benefits of REDD+ in Bangladesh

- Access major new source of bilateral and multilateral forest sector finance
- Future access to forest carbon finance
- Fundamental reform of forest governance
- Scaling up participatory forest management and social forestry
- Support for biodiversity conservation
- Coastal zone protection
