









Formation of Central Sulawesi's REDD+ **Working Group**

of multi-stakeholders consultations to build mutual understanding as well as to promote better coordination among multi-stakeholders in the Province. The multi-stakeholder consultations included a number of activities and decisions as follow:

The formation of a secretariat to support Central Sulawesi's REDD+ Working Group.

Indonesia formed a REDD+ Working Group (WG) in the province of Central Sulawesi after a number

The Provincial Forestry Service as UN-REDD Programme Indonesia's focal point in Central Sulawesi appointed its staff to sit in the Secretariat and support the REDD+ Working Group. The secretariat consists of 12 (twelve) staff members from different divisions in the Provincial Forestry Service that are assigned to support and facilitate the Central Sulawesi's REDD+ Working Group.

Capacity building towards FPIC conception through multi-stakeholders consultations

- The secretariat of Central Sulawesi's Forestry Service, NGOs, indigenous peoples, local community groups and academics sat together and discussed issues related to FPIC in a series of consultation sessions. The aim is to improve awareness and comprehension on FPIC to build multi-stakeholders capacity for its application, particularly within the Provincial Forestry Service and Provincial Unity & Civil Service Protection Agency (Keselamatan Bangsa dan Perlindungan Masyarakat or Kesbanglinmas). In the end, the multi-stakeholders consultations concluded the following: a. Improved understanding on FPIC
 - b. Potential implementation of FPIC in REDD+ c. Identified scope of FPIC in line with REDD+ activities
- 3. Dissemination of information on UN-REDD Programme Indonesia to private sector UN-REDD Programme Indonesia and Central Sulawesi's Forestry Service held a discussion with
- Central Sulawesi's Association of Indonesian Forest Concession Holders (Asosiasi Pengusaha Hutan Indonesia or APHI) with the following objectives: a. To gather inputs and/or information from Central Sulawesi's APHI about REDD+ and Forest Plantation Wood Production Permit (Izin Usaha Pemanfaatan Hasil Hutan Kayu or IUPHHK)

Central Sulawesi's REDD+ Working Group Facilitated by the Secretariat of Forestry Service and UN-REDD Programme Indonesia, indigenous peoples and local community groups held several meetings which were concluded by a workshop to reach these objectives: a. To discuss FPIC as part of REDD+ activities b. To seek involvement of local communities and indigenous peoples in REDD+ activities

Indonesia facilitated NGOs in Central Sulawesi to consolidate for the following objectives: To discuss stance and roles of NGOs in Central Sulawesi related to REDD+ and UN-REDD Programme Indonesia's activities. b. To select NGOs representatives in the REDD+ Working Group. In the end, five people were

selected as NGOs representatives to become members of the REDD+ Working Group.

Forestry Service and UN-REDD Programme

The formation of Central Sulawesi REDD+ Working Group As a conclusion of several multi-stakeholders discussions and consultations to better coordinate REDD+ activities in the Province, Central Sulawesi's REDD+ Working Group is finally formed. Membership of the Working Group consists of related agencies at the provincial government, management units of the Ministry of Forestry operating in Central Sulawesi, representatives of

NGOs', local communities and indigenous peoples, private sector, as well as UN-REDD Programme

The stakeholders agreed on the three issues above through a consensus, as later asserted in the Governor of Central Sulawesi's Decision Letter no. 522/84/Dishutda - G.ST/2011, dated February 18, 2011, regarding the formation and tasks of Centrals Sulawesi's REDD+ Working Group.

 - b. Play the mediation role in order to minimize conflicts and to bring solutions to problems among related stakeholders in the implementation of REDD+ in Central Sulawesi. Consult and recommend potential location to be assigned as the location of REDD+ Demontration Activities in Central Sulawesi.
- 4. Free, Prior and Informed Consent (FPIC), Province and Society Empowerment and Capacity Building: a. To communicate and to raise awareness about climate change and REDD+ scheme in the framework of reducing emissions from deforestation and forest degradation in Central Sulawesi. b. Motivate and create a collaborative ambiance among stakeholders in the framework of REDD+ activities
 - implementation in Central Sulawesi. Execute efforts to build the people's capacity to reduce and control emissions, deforestation and forest degradation in Central Sulawesi.
 - d. Recommend the FPIC working system in the preconditioning and implementation of REDD+ in Central Sulawesi.
