OVERALL SUMMARY

The global announcement of the 2014 Champions of the Earth Laureates was made in Washington DC on 19 November.

Huge media buzz was created through the different press engagements in the regions, the distribution of AV materials on social media as well as through various other channels.

PRODUCTION OF VIGNETTES

Eight vignettes were produced and distributed through a database with more than 1000 people. Four of these were produced as part of the ICA with DEPI (UNEP/ICA/DEPI/2015/FMEB/003/AD1), to contribute to the approved UN-REDD Global Framework for 2011 – 2015, highlighting the achievements of the four winners in conserving forests and the marine environment.

The videos were also shown at the event, distributed on various social media channels, to a number of international media outlets as well as other online outreach platforms. The links are available on the Champions of the Earth website, youtube and vimeo.





The United States alone accounted for 29% of the total coverage closely followed by Mexico at 23%. The Netherlands and Spain came in third and fourth , representing 10% and 7% of the total coverage respectivley.
