Programme Highlights

Goal: To provide comments to the REDD+ Taskforce on the REDD+ Readiness process and provide a forum to represent the views of stakeholders, especially civil society and NGOs.

Objectives:

- Collecting, summarizing and collating comments on, draft reports and proposed decisions of the REDD+ Taskforce from their respective constituencies. The Taskforce is required to send these documents to the Consultation Group and to respond to any comments raised on timely basis. Representatives must share this information with their constituents;
- Contributing to draft reports and other communications of the REDD+ Taskforce;
- Sharing information on developments relating to REDD+ within their constituencies with the REDD+ Taskforce, REDD+ Taskforce Secretariat and other members of the consultation group.

The Cambodia REDD+ Consultation Group is involved in all aspects of **REDD+**.

Beneficiaries: All non-governmental stakeholders in Cambodia.

Lessons Learned/Achievements:

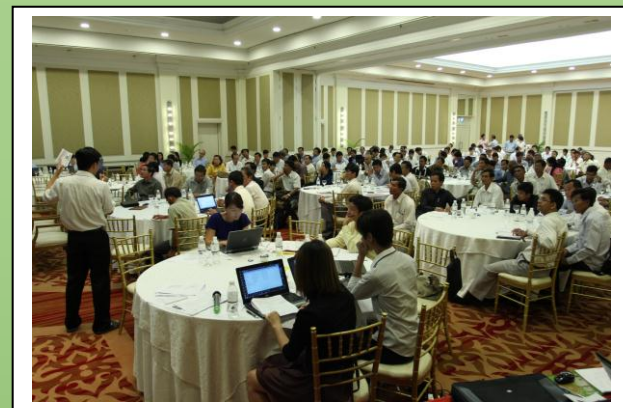
- Full consultation with all constituents is extremely challenging and time consuming for some groups such as Indigenous Peoples and Community Networks because of the remoteness of many constituents;
- Feedback from the Taskforce on advice provided by the Consultation Group is essential to sustain commitment of CG members.

Challenge: Information flow mechanisms, interactions between CG representatives and their constituents, and technical information flow are still challenging.
