### **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

Under the overall guidance of Director, Climate, Energy and Tenure Division, and under the direct supervision of Senior Natural Resources Officer (Climate Change Coordination and REDD+), the incumbent will:

- support the development and implementation of FAO and UN-REDD Programme tools and guidelines related to REDD+ safeguards, with an emphasis on governance-related safeguards;
- organize and participate in internal and external meetings and events to develop and promote FAO's tools and guidelines related to REDD+ safeguards;
- support multi-stakeholder processes to develop FAO and UN-REDD Programme guidance on REDD+ safeguards;
- liaise with partner agencies, specifically UNDP and UNEP, for safeguards related activities of the UN-REDD Programme;
- liaise with FAO HQ and decentralized staff to enhance coordinated approaches and support to countries in their work on REDD+ safeguards;
- prepare information and web pages on FAO's work related to REDD+ safeguards;
- provide assistance in the preparation of FAO contributions to UNFCCC, including policy analyses, submissions and other reports;
- perform other related duties as assigned.

#### MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Candidates should meet the following:

- Advanced university degree in natural resources, social sciences or a related field
- Three years of relevant experience in governance and other social, environmental and institutional aspects of natural resources management
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and limited knowledge of one of the other two

- Proven capacity to analyse topics and write technical reports related to natural resource management

- Quality of both oral and written communication skills
- Relevance of academic qualifications
