OBJECTIVES

- To provide UN-REDD colleagues with an approach for better understanding and responding to development challenges, taking into account the political and institutional context in their respective countries.
- To enhance the effectiveness of UN-REDD national programmes based on a realistic assessment of stakeholders' interests, incentives and constraints;
- To explore concrete ways the ICA can be applied to or used in combination with UN-REDD's work
