Scaling up the REDD+ Readiness

- **Indonesia Forest Climate Alliance (IFCA)**
 - **COP 13, Bali 2007:**
 - Indonesia puts forward forests as a priority area
 - **National Strategy for the REDD+ *Readiness Phase***
 - **G20 meeting and COP 15, 2009:**
 - Commitment to reduce emissions
 - Focus on the forest
 - **Indonesia- Norway Lol**
 - **Presidential Decree to establish the Indonesia REDD+ Task Force**
- ➔ **National REDD+ Strategy** for the REDD+ *implementation* phase

Indonesia's commitments

Indonesia has committed to a 26 - 41 percent co2 emission reduction target by 2020



“

“We are devising an energy mix policy including LULUCF (Land Use, Land Use Change, and Forestry) that will reduce our emissions by **26 percent by 2020** from BAU (Business As Usual). With international support, we are confident that we can reduce emissions by as much as **41 percent**”

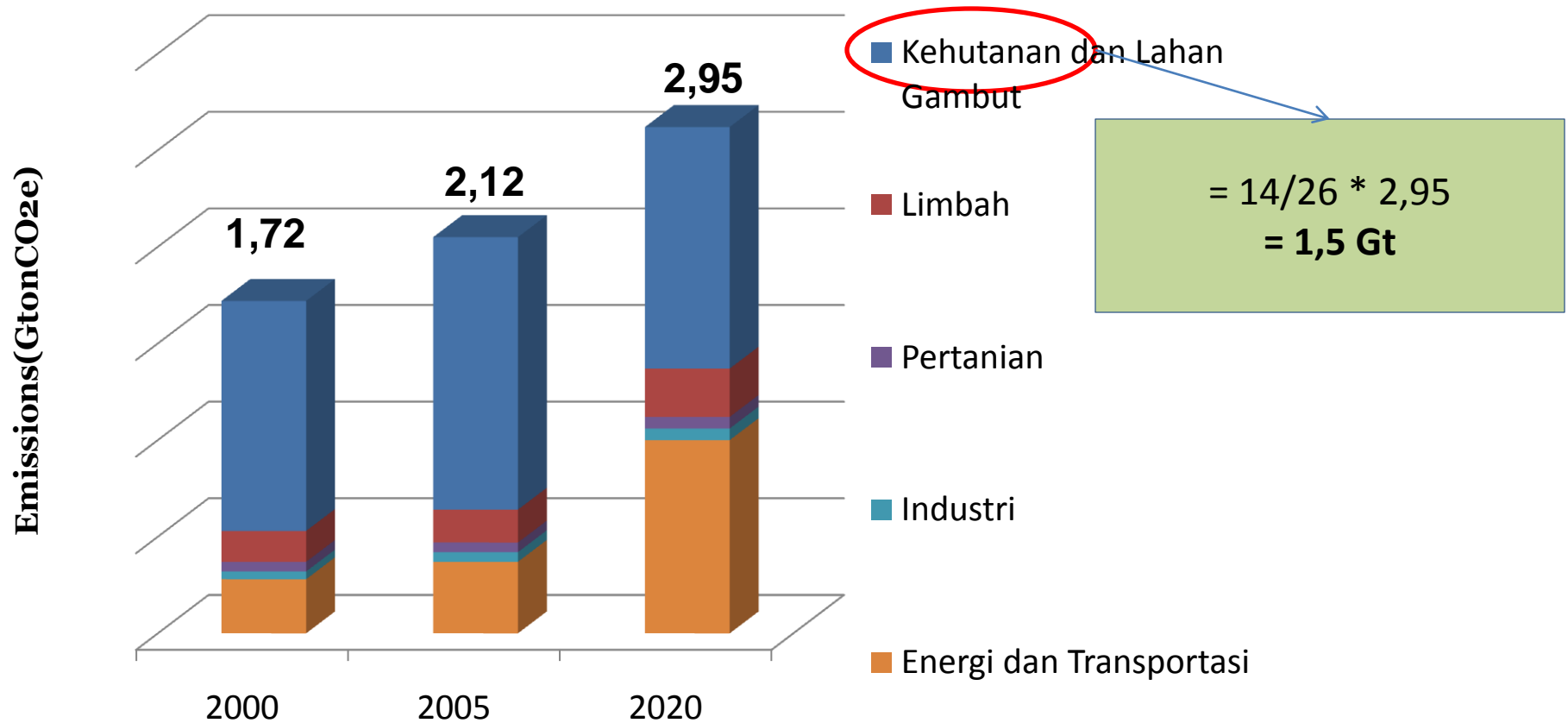

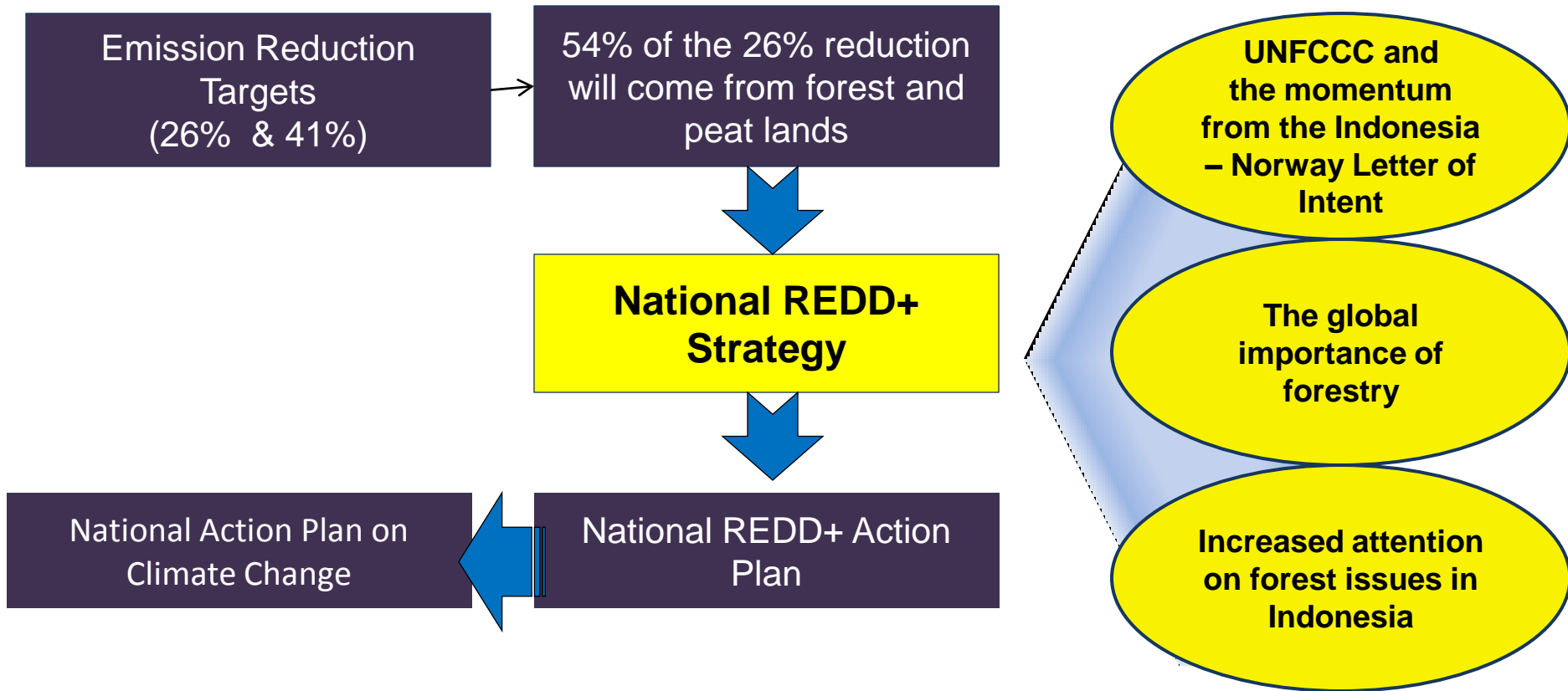

Indonesian Emissions

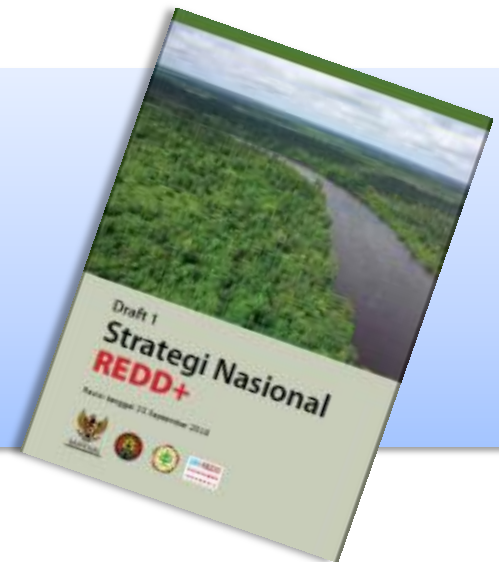

THE DRAFTING PROCESS



The structure

- **Writer team:**
 - 7 persons with expertise on REDD+
- **Working group:**
 - Give technical inputs to the drafts. Civil society, university, government at technical level. Chair: Head of Forestry DG, Bappenas, Mr. Basah.
- **Steering Committee:**
 - Policy guidelines. Members: high government officials from Bappenas, MoFor, Public Works and other relevant line ministries. Chair: Bappenas Vice President, Mr. Lukita.

1. Preparation meetings between Bappenas and Ministry of Forestry

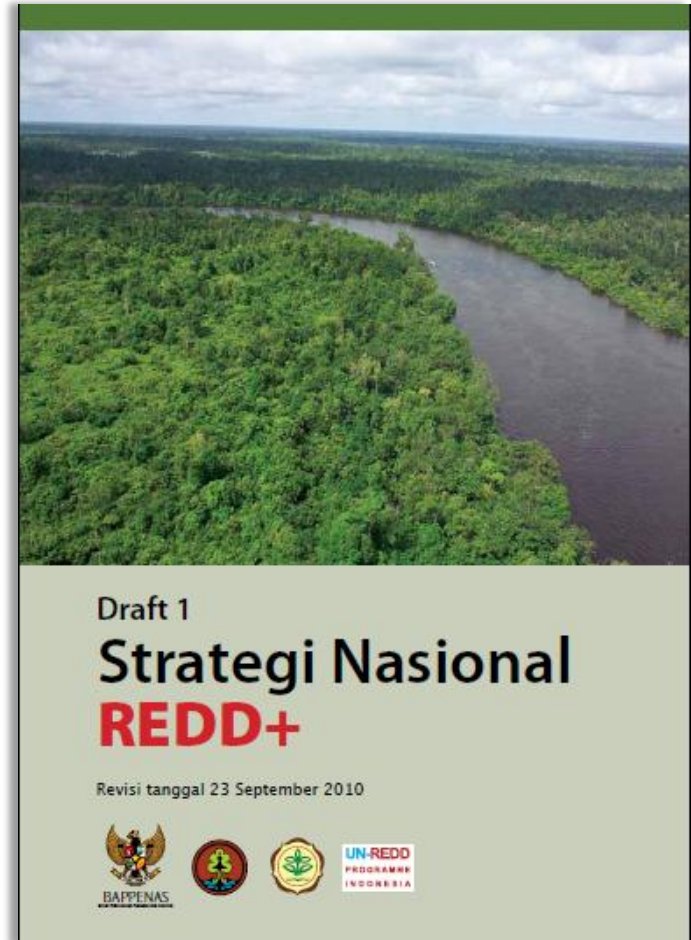
- Create Writer Team, Working Group and Steering Committee

- Writers create 1st Draft, (1st Draft launched 24 Sept)

- 7 Regional Consultation Meetings; Local government, civil society, iP and private sector (30 Sept- 22 Oct)

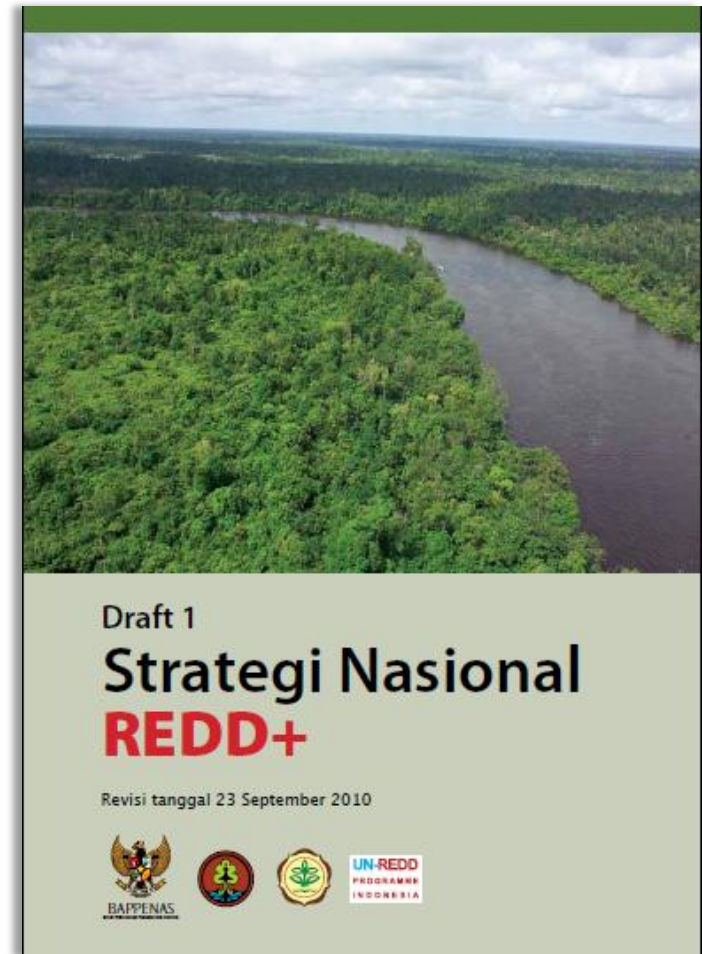

- Bappenas and Ministry of Forestry report on the process and deliver the draft to the Indonesia REDD+ Task Force

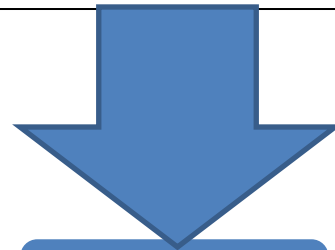

- Indonesia REDD+ Task Force continues the process

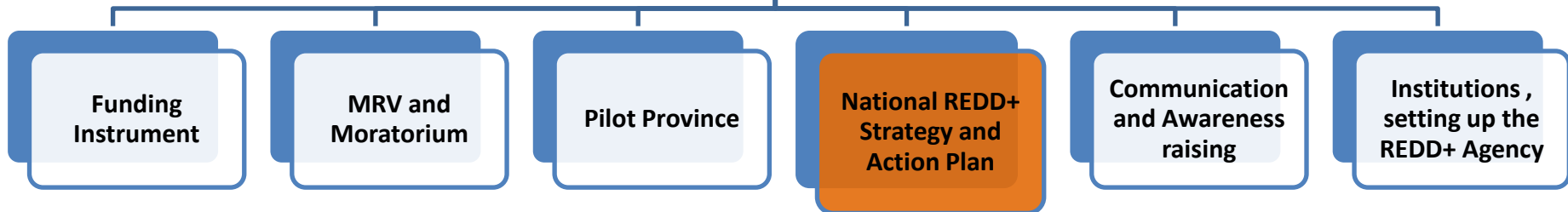

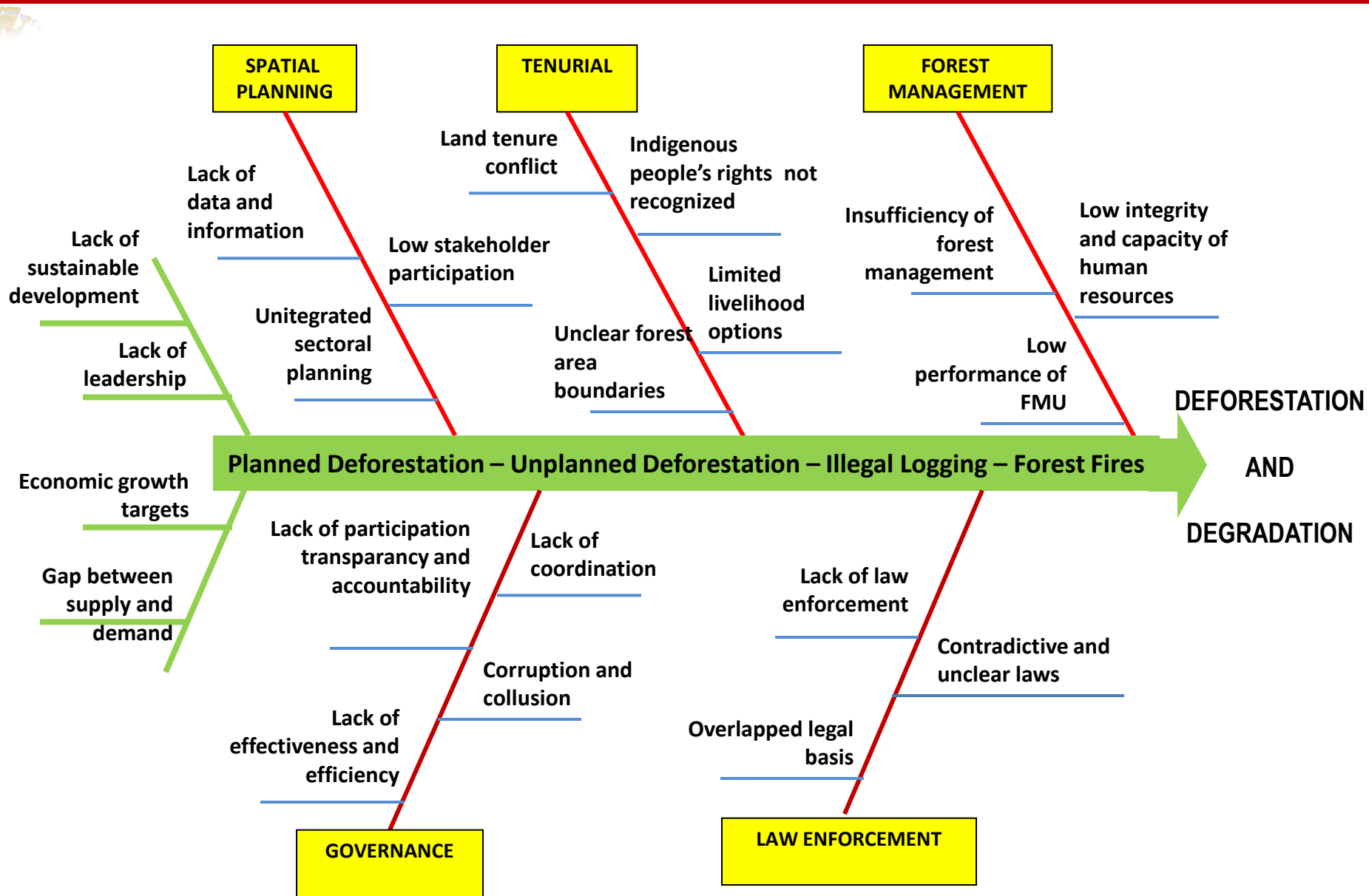

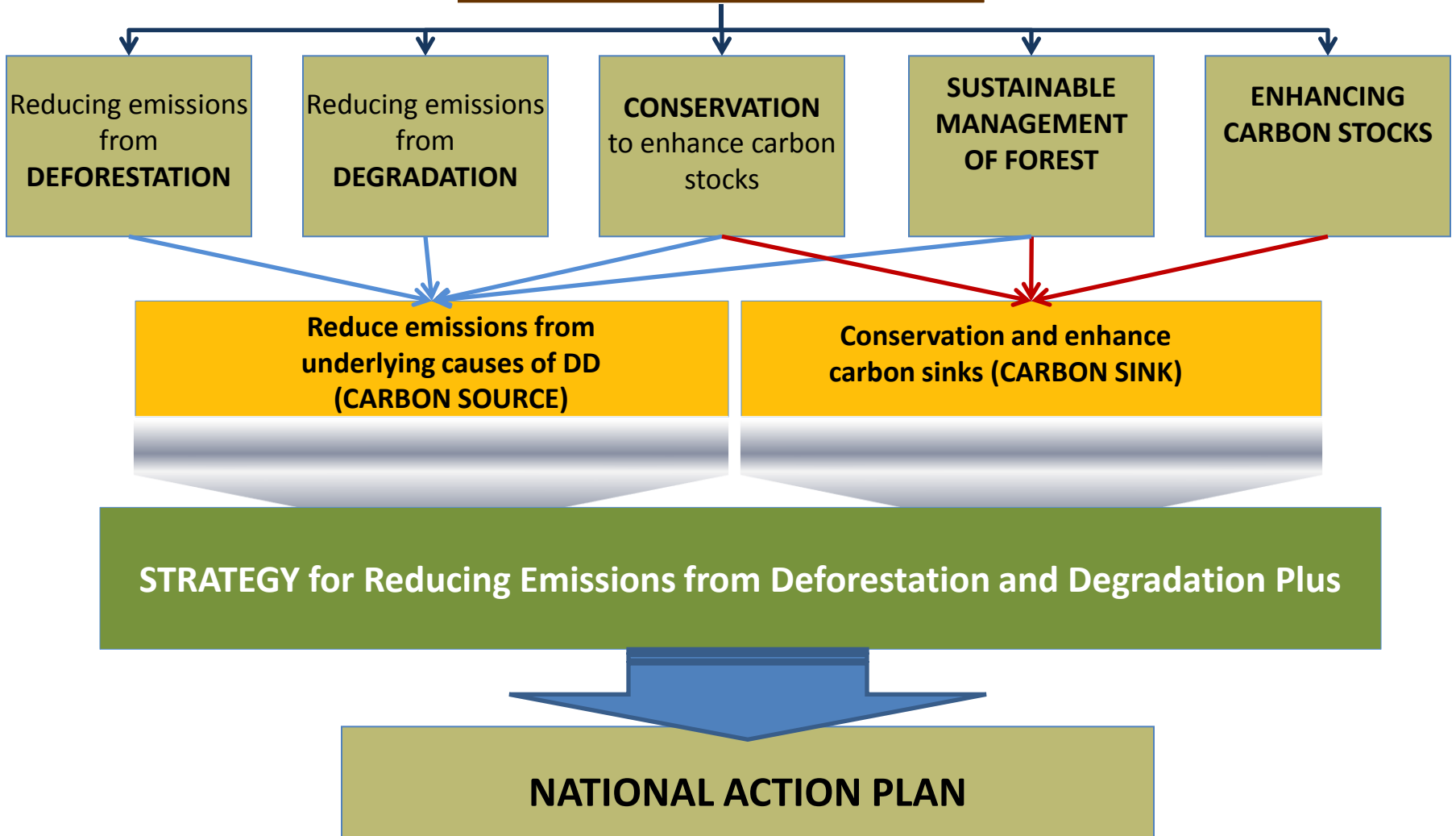

Conclusions in the National REDD+ Strategy

- Need to develop the National Action Plan
- REDD + mainstreaming in development planning
- The need for studies related to:
 - Economic impact of REDD+
 - Cultural and social mapping
 - Policies and regulations relevant for REDD+ implementation
 - Incentives and disincentives in the land use management



Immediate results :

- A milestone and reference for **multi-stakeholder participation** processes
- Approaching national **consensus** on the draft National REDD+ Strategy
- Increased **coordination** at national level; BAPPENAS, Ministry of Forestry and Indonesia REDD+ Task Force
- UN-REDD is an appreciated partner for the government and other stakeholders and stays relevant in a rapidly changing political situation
