National Forest Monitoring System Action Plans

OBJECTIVES

Objectives



- To set out all the details, tasks and responsibilities required to develop Mongolia's National Forest Monitoring System to ensure:
 - Transparency
 - Accountability
 - Consistency with international guidance
- Clarify institutional arrangements for implementation of Mongolia's National Forest Monitoring System
- Follow phased approach to technical capacity building and implementation
- Collate all sources of financial and technical support into one document
 - Can see what is funded and what requires funding
 - Useful instrument for seeking international technical support
- Must be country-driven!





National Forest Monitoring System Action Plans

EXAMPLES FROM OTHER COUNTRIES

Different Countries, Different Approaches

- Mongolia is one of five countries to date that have developed (draft) National Forest Monitoring System Action Plans in the Asia Pacific region with the support of UN-REDD
- Each country has taken an individual approach, based on its national circumstances
- A key activity is to reach agreement on the roles that different ministries, institutions, agencies and/or organizations will play
 - Institutional arrangements for the National Inventory System


















EXAMPLE from Indonesia: Structure of the Satellite Land Monitoring System Shared Platform

BACKGROUND

Background and Timeline



- Mongolia requested financial and technical support from UN-REDD in 2012
- The REDD+ support from FAO was for
 - Developing a National Forest Monitoring System Action Plan
 - Support for integrating remote sensing into the national forest inventory methodology (working with GIZ to support the Government)
- A draft of the Action Plan was written in 2012
 - Activities paused during the creation of the new Ministry of Environment and Green Development
- Now re-starting work on the Action Plan through this consultation workshop
 - Process requires Government ownership and leadership


Content of Mongolia's Action Plan



- The document includes limited amount of technical background because the UN-REDD background document on National Forest Monitoring Systems for REDD+ is now available in Mongolian
 - Can be used as a reference and have the Action Plan as an action-orientated document – a practical guide

- Introduction
- Capacity Assessment
 - Remote sensing and GIS, Forest Inventory, Greenhouse Gas Inventory
- National Forest Monitoring System Development through REDD+ Implementation
 - <u>Phase 1</u>: Institutional Arrangements and Capacity Building
 - Phase 2: Demonstration and Monitoring
 - <u>Phase 3</u>: National Monitoring and MRV
- Timeline (Work Plan)
- Budget



What is missing from the Action Plan



- Agreed institutional arrangements
- Institutional arrangements of individual components
 - For example how to implement and manage the national forest inventory?
- Currently quite "light" on technical detail
 - More detail and updated information is needed on capacity assessment for each technical component
 - More detail on specific activities and processes
 - Have overview of activities but no details for example there are no details of quality assurance and quality control procedures
- You (Mongolia) need to decide how much detail to go into
 - Keep it a light and accessible document or make it a more practical guide?

Next Steps for the Action Plan

 - For the overall system

Next Steps for the Action Plan



• FAO/UN-REDD can provide further support if required/requested!

2014

- FAO/UN-REDD has a budget for further support to Mongolia (\$45,000)
 - Need decisions on what kind of further support Mongolia would like to receive
- UN-REDD Programme will invite Mongolia to prepare a <u>full</u> National Programme
 - To provide broad support for REDD+ capacity building
 - Will include support for areas such as stakeholder engagement (UNDP), REDD+ governance (UNDP), safeguards (UNEP) – and National Forest Monitoring System (FAO)
 - This will provide larger-scale funds to support the implementation of the National Forest Monitoring System Action Plan
