Coordination & Stakeholder engagement

- Specific national REDD+ units established (most countries)
- Civil society platforms for REDD+ & climate change established; *e.g.*:
 - ✓ GTCR (DRC)
 - ✓ CACO-REDD (Republic of Congo)
 - ✓ Stakeholder Forum on REDD+ (CRS, Nigeria)
- Provincial networks of stakeholders for REDD+ (Zambia)
- Joint FLEGT/REDD+ platform (Côte d'Ivoire)
- REDD+ roadmap (Malawi)
- Inter-ministerial Task Force (Côte d'Ivoire)
- REDD+ universities (DRC, Nigeria)
- *Chaminuka Protocol* (Zambia)

REDD+ Strategy work (I)

- Key analytical work; such as:
 - Assessment of drivers of deforestation (with geographic declination) [FAO]
 - Economic evaluation of forest ecosystems services [UNEP]
 - Reforestation potential [FAO]
 - REDD+ & the Green Economy [UNEP]
 - Institutional & Context Analysis [UNDP]
 - Forests, agriculture, charcoal & livelihoods dimensions [FAO/UNDP/UNEP]

REDD+ Strategy work (II)

- DRC: A comprehensive REDD+ strategy, with pillars, RLs, targets *et al.* (adopted by Council of Ministers, 2012) – then declined in a solid REDD+ Investment Plan (2014-2016)
 - Tanzania: An action plan for REDD+
 - Zambia: National REDD+ Strategy under formulation (for 2014)
 - Ethiopia: Climate Resilient & Green Growth Strategy (adopted, under sectoral design)
 - Republic of Congo: Ongoing REDD+ strategic work (for 2014)
 - Nigeria: REDD+ Strategy roadmap for Cross River State in design (sub-national approach)
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- Diversity of approaches, yet importance of a robust work (technical analysis --- national consensus --- political commitment)
 - UN-REDD considering to prepare a methodological guidance for building REDD+ strategies, and to support south-south exchanges for the building of REDD+ strategies.

National Forest Monitoring Systems, Safeguards Information Systems & related work

- NFMS designed, partly operational, with a web interface (DRC, Zambia)
- National Carbon Monitoring Centre conceived/established (Tanzania)
- REDD+ Portal & REDD+ *wiki* (Zambia)
- Spatial analysis of multiple benefits of REDD+ (Tanzania, Nigeria, DRC, Republic of Congo)
- REDD+ Registry (DRC, forthcoming in Kenya and other countries)

- Corruption risk assessments & anti-corruption measures (DRC, Kenya)
- REDD+ Governance analytical series (Kenya)
- Participatory Governance Assessment (Nigeria)
- National REDD+ Fund established & operational (DRC)
- Planned REDD+ finance options work (Kenya, Côte d'Ivoire)
- REDD+ indicators in *Economic Governance Matrix* (DRC)
- South-south exchange series on REDD+ Finance (DRC & Ethiopia representing Africa; soon Kenya & Republic of Congo to join)

International engagement

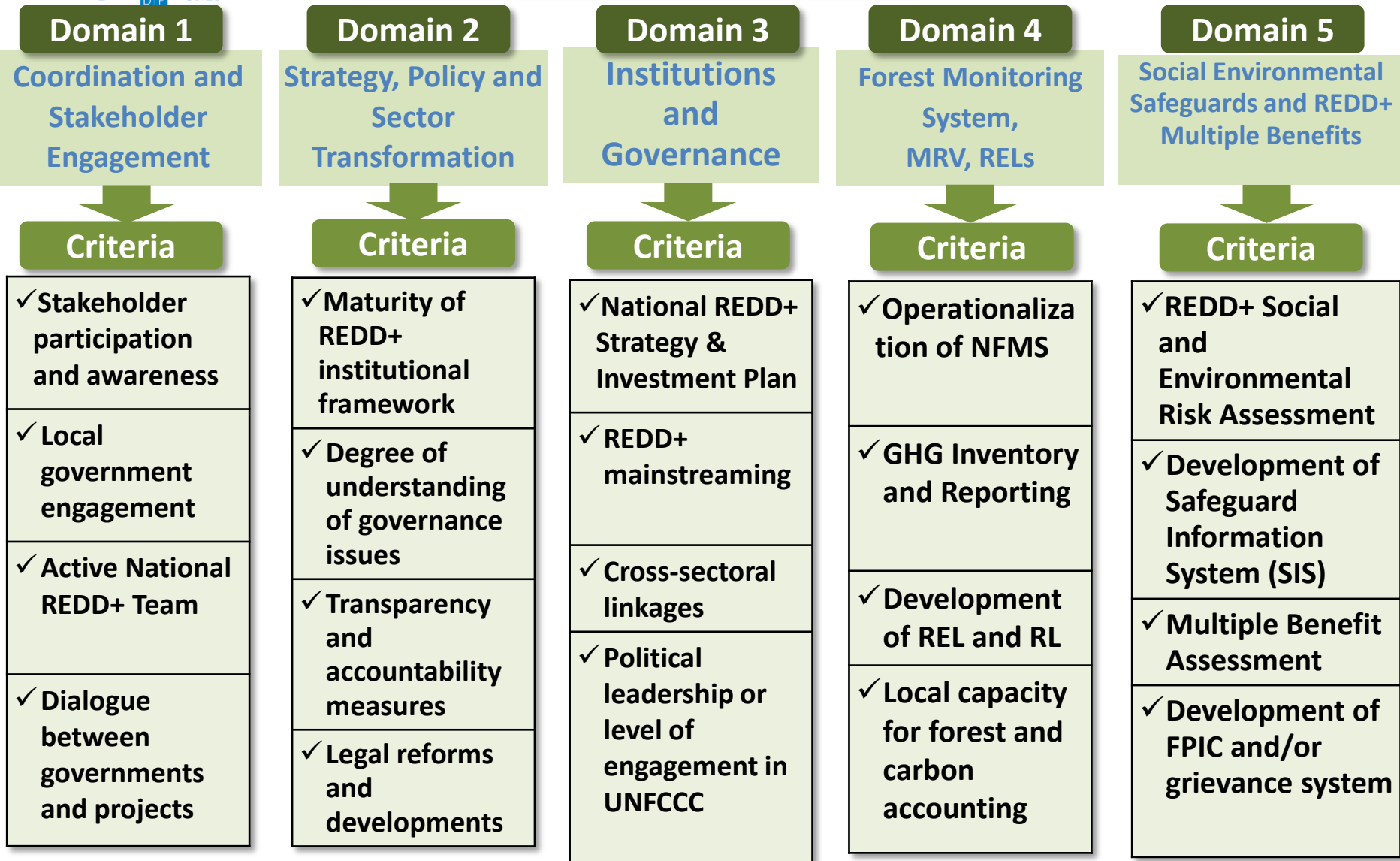
- DRC: Leader of Africa caucus in UNFCCC / REDD+ negotiations
- Joint Declaration of Intent
- Host of UN-REDD and FCPF executive boards: Kenya, Republic of Congo
- Nigeria: co-chair of UN-REDD Policy Board (2013-2014)
- Nigeria REDD+ & Climate Change Diplomacy initiative (forthcoming)

Quick REDD+ readiness assessment

- Context & rationale:
 - Countries wish to know where they stand in terms of progress in REDD+
 - Existing methodologies too complex or for advanced processes only
 - Focus on enabling factors for moving towards REDD+ investments & finance
- Status: In advanced design phase with preliminary use/testing

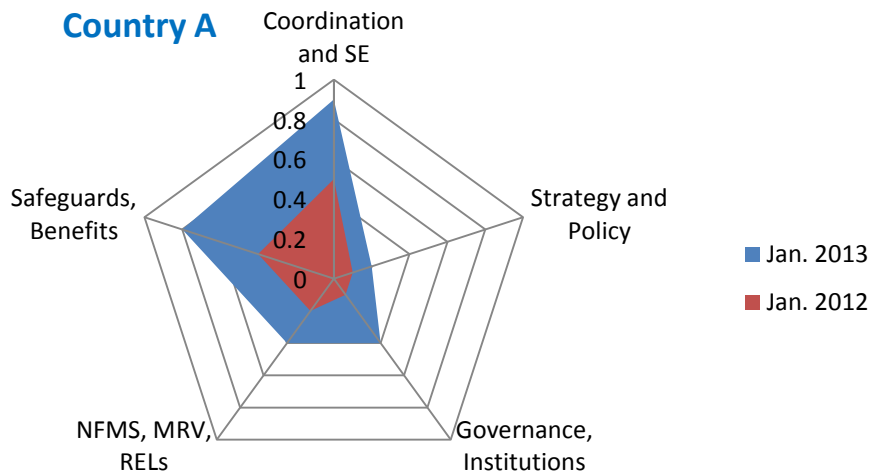

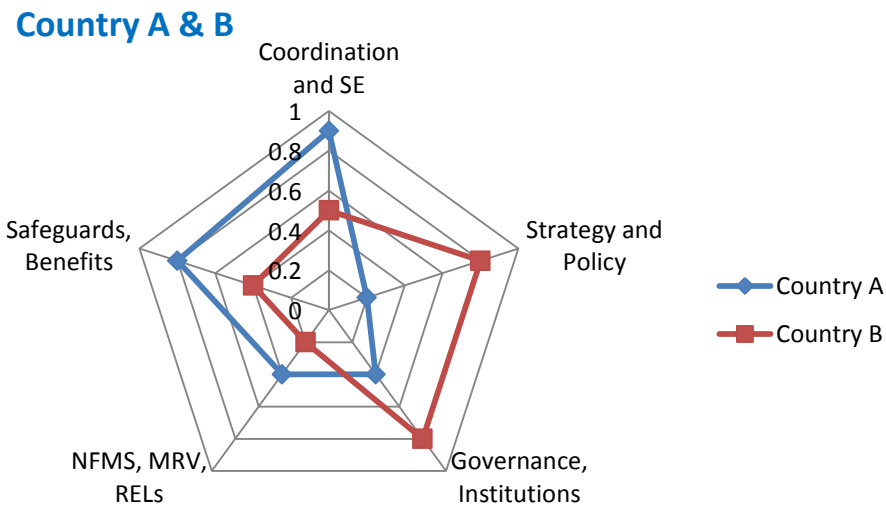

Synopsis of the quick REDD+ readiness assessment methodology

- **Simple, handy and quick:** 5 domains, 20 Qs with simple qualification
- **Consistency:**
 - UNFCCC requirements (Cancun Agreements *et al.*)
 - Alignment with work areas of UN-REDD Strategy Programme 2011 -2015
 - Coherent with the FCPF's R-Package
- **A policy analysis tool**
 - self-assessment (countries, diverse stakeholders, UN-REDD)
 - foster multi-stakeholder analysis and dialogue on REDD+
 - quick-fix unbalances in REDD+ readiness,
 - identify work streams with less progresses – guide technical & financial support
 - sustain dialogue between governments, partners and donors
 - provide guidance for programme reviews and capacity-needs assessments
 - identify opportunities for south-south exchanges

Application and prospects of the quick REDD+ readiness assessment

- **Preliminary use:**

- Tanzania (REDD+ gap assessment)
- DRC (perhaps for forthcoming UN-REDD DRC final evaluation)
- Offered for the Capacity Needs Assessment (voluntary)
- An online survey is under design

- **Early insights:**

- In some domains, countries have similar patterns of REDD+ progress
- In other domains, countries diverge in progress and outputs

- **Potential:**

- Help enabling South-South exchanges
- Assist REDD+ academy to identify areas that require capacity-building, and countries that can be “teachers” of specific REDD+ components
