# Current status of forest tenure in the world

- Regional forest tenure review: status & trends
- Known impacts of forest tenure reform
  - Evidence from scientific literature
  - Examples include: Forest restoration in China and reduced deforestation in Brazil

# Emerging international norms for land & forest tenure rights

Voluntary Guidelines on the Responsible Governance of Tenure of Land, Fisheries and Forests in the Context of National Food Security (2012)

- Closely related to Food Security but has useful guidance for REDD+
- Operational assessment for REDD+

#### Current status of rights to carbon and benefits

- Review of current legislation on carbon rights
  Some examples include: New Zealand, Brazil, etc..
- Lessons from PES
- Lessons from pilot REDD+ programs (CIFOR)
