REDD+ activities are to be undertaken in accordance with **UNFCCC safeguards**

The PGA can help contribute to the development of 'national systems for providing relevant information on how safeguards are addressed and respected' (paragraphs 69 and 71d of the Cancun Agreement)

Transparent and effective national forest governance structures



Characteristics of PGAs







- Country-led the country decides to pursue a PGA of its own accord, and owns the process
- Can be conducted by a number of different stakeholders
- Can be applied at different levels (national, provincial, local) to assess forest governance
- Includes participation of both state and non-state actors
- Can influence political decision-making and policy-making



PGA Objectives







- Identify REDD+ governance challenges and risks
- Provide robust evidence base to recommend responses for overcoming these challenges and risks
- Facilitate sustainability of long-term policy reform through ownership
- Provide a framework for a participatory process at the country level for sharing information on how (governance) safeguards are promoted, addressed and respected



PGA principles:







Accountability: Country-led assessments act as a critical accountability mechanism for governance performance to local stakeholders.

Participation: A broad and representative range of national actors have opportunities to provide input into key stages of the assessment process.

Transparency: National actors have unrestricted access to information on the assessment process and the results of the assessment are made available to the public as a public good.

Legitimacy: National actors agree that the assessment process and its results are legitimate and should be followed.

Pilots: Geographical Scope

	Indonesia	Nigeria	Ecuador
NATIONAL LEVEL:	Expert Panel. Involves national actors — such as ministries, REDD+ Task Force, Agencies (such as BAPPENAS) and national civil society actors (think tanks and CSOs).	PGA Task Force (national and state). Involves UN-REDD National Programme, relevant ministries and agencies, and possibly also national level civil society actors.	Integrated into UN-REDD Joint National Programme (JNP). Governance indicators developed for the PGA will feed into the Safeguards Information System (SIS).
LOCAL LEVEL:	Originally piloted at 10 provinces and in 2 districts within each province, in addition to the national level. Expanding to 12 provinces in 2014.	Cross River State, at 3 pilot sites with local councils and stakeholder involvement. The PGA Coordinator sits in the Cross River State Forestry Commission.	Integrated into national-level SIS
