Political will

Political will, national leadership, and robust partnerships between industrialized and developing countries are essential to reducing deforestation and forest degradation. REDD+ depends on the shared commitment of developing countries to contribute significant amounts of their forest resources and developed countries to provide sufficient predictable funding. REDD+ partnerships must be flexible and coordinated in their approach, respond to developing country needs and be based on lasting reductions in deforestation and forest degradation. No single organization can address the complexities of implementing REDD+ alone: it requires all of us.
