REDD+ Academy: Current status

- Need for a REDD+ capacity development initiative to enable systematic, focused capacity development to deliver REDD+ on the ground
- Current capacity efforts for REDD+ are:
- Offered by a variety of often uncoordinated actors
- Short-term with limited follow-up
- Covering only parts of the required REDD+ competencies and knowledge
- Targeting varied audiences with a tendancey towards unncoordinated delivery









REDD+ Academy: Current status

- Growing body of knowledge and experience on REDD+ readiness and implementation
- Potential for South-South Cooperation
- Significant training and capacity building experience and lessons learned from national and regional levels, including:
- UN-REDD Programme, including the partner agencies (FAO, UNDP and UNEP)
- Partners in the wider REDD+ community









REDD+ Academy: Suggested Topics

Types of topics a REDD+ Academy could cover:

- Scientific evidence on climate change and significance of forests for sustainable development
- The rationale behind REDD+
- International commitments on sustainable forest management,
 climate change, biodiversity, and rights of indigenous peoples
- MRV and monitoring capacity for REDD+
- Credible, inclusive national governance and tenure systems for REDD+ implementation









REDD+ Academy: Suggested Topics

Types of topics a REDD+ Academy could cover:

- Stakeholder engagement including Indigenous people and Free,
 Prior and Informed Consent (FPIC)
- Safeguards and multiple benefits of REDD+
- Linkages between REDD+ and a Green Economy transformation processes
- Communication and public awareness
- REDD+ funding, benefit distribution and public-private partnerships











REDD+ Academy: Design Phase

- 1. Establish a REDD+ design team consisting of representatives of the UN-REDD Programme and other suitable donors and partners
- 2. Hold regional workshops, bringing together stakeholders to address key questions and ensure a demand driven outcome
- **3. Hold a consolidation meeting** to finalize a comprehensive REDD+ Acadamy programme and implementation plan
- **4. Identify and engage Universities** from UNEP network of partner Universities to outline curriculum development and delivery

Regional Workshop Africa	Workshop of key stakeholders to address key questions	Informal consultation during Regional Safeguards Workshop, Nairobi (17-19 September) / Workshop in Q1 2014
Regional Workshop Asia- Pacific	Workshop of key stakeholders to address key questions	Q 1, 2014
Regional Workshop Latin America & Car.	Workshop of key stakeholders to address key questions	Q 2, 2014
Consolidation meeting	Meeting to consolidate inputs from three workshops and finalise design and implementation plan for REDD+ Academy. Curriculum design would be finalized at this meeting and development of specific content would then continue from July to November.	July 2014
REDD+ Academy launched	Launch of first stage of REDD+ Academy	November 2014 (to be launched at UNFCCC COP)

Aims of the Sourcebook

- To provide guidance on curriculum development and integration of REDD+ concepts and methods into relevant postgraduate programmes in Universities
- To facilitate the access of universities to REDD+ materials available in UN-REDD
- To engage university networks as strategic platforms and centres of excellence for mainstreaming REDD+ education, research, development and outreach to a large numbers of actors

- Forest carbon and climate change (module 1),
- The multiple benefits of forests (module 2)
- The causes of deforestation and forest degradation (module
 3)
- Solutions to reverse deforestation and forest degradation (module 4).

- REDD+ readiness process (module 6).









Forests in a Changing Climate: A Sourcebook for Integrating REDD+ into Academic Programmes Modules

- Systems for monitoring, reporting and verification of forests (module 7)
- Performance based incentives for reducing deforestation and forest degradation (module 8)
- Social, environmental and governance safeguards (module 9),
- The costs of REDD+ (module 10)
- Funding for REDD+ (module 11).
- REDD+ within broader efforts aimed at fostering a global transition to a green economy (module 12).









REDD+ Academy

It is proposed that the REDD+ Academy is a 'rotating' Academy without a fixed location, moving between UN-REDD partner countries which offer to host it (in partnership with a leading national University).

The REDD+ Academy will be organized as **in-person formal training sessions** at regional level, with in-depth focus on the host country.

The Academy will be delivered in partnership with a **globally recognized learning institution** with established learning tools, and in partnership with **key UN-REDD Programme partners**, such as the World Bank.

A **design and development process** will take place over the next 6 months to finalize the REDD+ Academy concept, with a view to have the first training session at the end of 2014 or early 2015.
