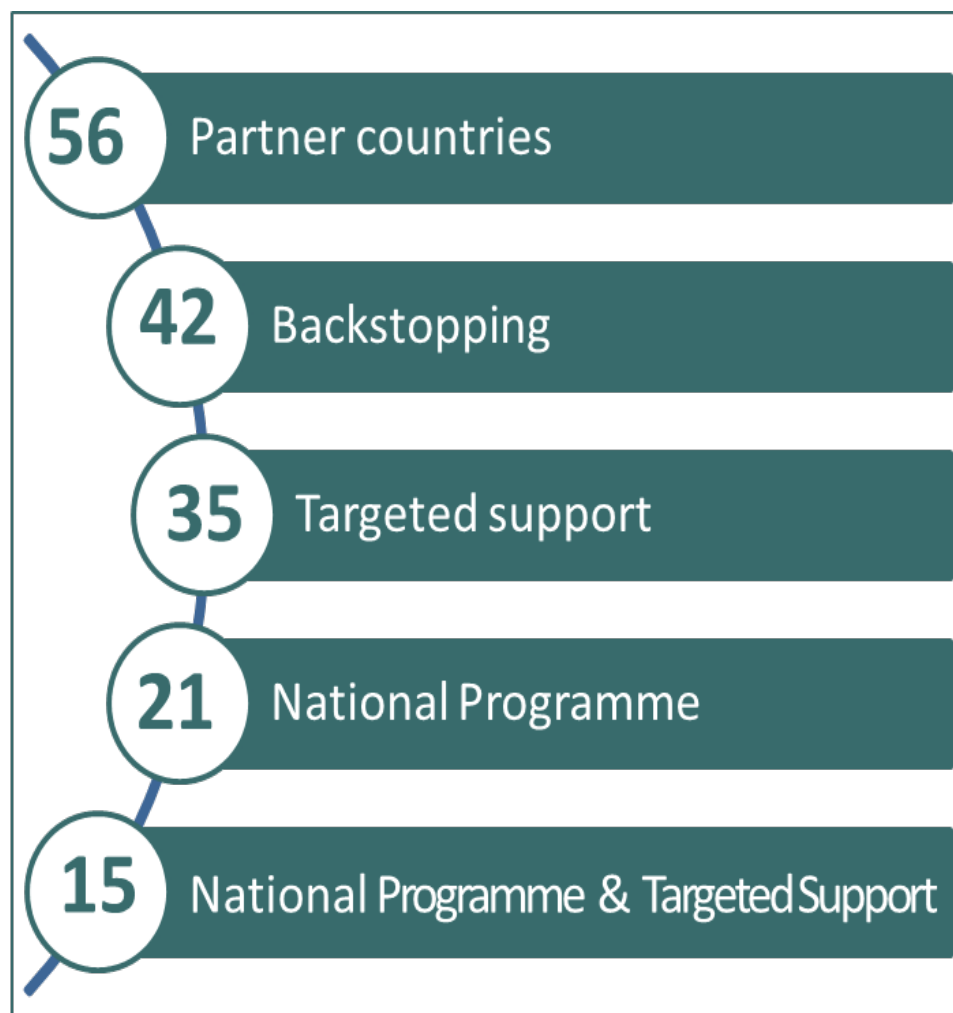
### Secretariat

# SNA and NATIONAL PROGRAMMES

SNA and National Programme are mutually complementary:

- Targeted Support and Backstopping help to fill the necessary gaps at any stage of National Programmes.
  - Backstopping is provided to all countries with National Programmes.
  - Targeted Support to 66% of the National Programme countries.
- Countries without National Programmes can access Targeted Support and Backstopping for specific readiness areas.

# SNA Work Plan and Budget: PROCESS

- ✓ Policy Board invited to provide guidance on priorities to consider.
- ✓ Guidance from the Policy Board sent to the Secretariat 80 working days prior to the Policy Board meeting.
- ✓ Draft SNA work plan and budget, with a response matrix circulated to the Policy Board 35 working days before the meeting.
- ✓ The Secretariat organized an Information Session prior to the meeting for consideration of budget proposal by the Policy Board.

# Country specific support

## Targeted support

- demand-driven
- small scale
- fast track funding
- technical or advisory in nature, capacity strengthening support
- support under one or more of the five technical Work Areas
- UN-REDD has comparative advantage
- accessible to all partner countries, including countries with National Programmes

## Backstopping

- **electronic and mission-based support of technical support**
- by **technical experts from regional nodes** and **global headquarters**
- Supports national programmes and targeted support
- Fills gaps and responds to additional needs of the countries

# Targeted support procedure

## Criteria:

- scope is not covered by other multi or bilateral initiatives or its National Programme
- country is expected to have developed or in the process or with a view of developing National REDD+ Strategy
- Review request against:
  - Consistency of the request with the objectives of the UN-REDD Programme;
  - Potential contribution of the targeted support to national REDD+ efforts ;
  - Participating agencies' availability of technical and financial resources;
  - Alignment with the agencies' programming priorities for the relevant work areas.

Country sends request to the Secretariat through its National REDD+ Focal Point (Voluntary form)

Secretariat registers the request and communicates to the Agencies for decision to support.

Agencies communicate to the Secretariat their decisions (usually within 3 working days).

Secretariat responds to the country.
