- Specific objective: Assist the Government of Viet Nam in developing an effective REDD regime in Viet Nam and to contribute to reduction of greenhouse gas emission and climate change
- Pilot site: Lam Ha and Di Linh districts, Lam Dong province









#### **General information**

- Outcome 1: Improved technical and institutional capacity to manage and coordinate REDD activities in Viet Nam
- Outcome 2: Improved Capacity to manage REDD and provide other Payment for Ecological Services at district level through sustainable development planning and implementation
- Outcome 3: Improved knowledge of approaches to reduce regional displacement of emissions.
