Summary of Minutes	The third Programme Executive Board (PEB) meeting of the Sri Lanka UN-REDD Programme was held on the 22 <sup>nd</sup> May 2014 from 2.00 - 5.15 pm at "Saptha Parisara Mandapaya" Conference Room, Ministry of Environment and Renewable Energy, Battaramulla, Sri Lanka.	Info
	The meeting was attended by 18 members and 12 observers. The meeting was co-chaired by Mr. B. M. U. D. Basnayake, Secretary, Ministry of Environment & Renewable Energy and Ms. Beth S. Crawford, FAO Representative for Sri Lanka and the Maldives.	
	National Programme Manager (NPM) informed the participants on the progress of the decisions made at the second PEB meeting and progress during January - May 2014 was delivered by the National Programme Director (NPD).	
	The Programme Team's responses to the 8 point IP expectations were tabled and discussed with the additional support from the officers of relevant government institutions. These responses were agreed by the members and the PMU was asked to take further actions to meet the expectations. The revised annual work plan for 2014 was approved by the members.	
Welcome Remarks	Ms. Crawford highlighted the importance of the UN-REDD Programme in addressing climate change and its impacts and also the protection of natural resources in the country.	Info
	She further expressed that the 29% of Sri Lanka's existing forest cover is not only catering to the national interests but also contributing in meeting challenges such as adverse effects of climate change through reducing emissions caused by forest degradation and deforestation. The Sri Lanka UN-REDD Programme supports the Government to enhance the capacity of its staff and other stakeholders to develop a sound national REDD+ strategy.	
	Further, she highlighted that there is a great potential in achieving socio-economic development goals in Sri Lanka. She also commented positively on the progress that the Programme has achieved so far. She also mentioned that the PEB members are ready to continue with the wonderful cooperation for the success of the Programme.	
	Finally she thanked the Ministry and all other stakeholders, including, the National Programme Director of the Pogramme and PMU staff for	

their leadership and hard work.  Opening Remarks  Mr. B.M.U.D. Basnayake, giving his welcome remarks, appreciated the presence of a representative membership in the PEB. 
