Statement of the National Readiness Preparation Proposal (R-PP) Review Workshop participants on the draft R-PP for the National UN-REDD Programme for Sri Lanka

Today, 12 January 2012, over 40 members of a wide range of stakeholders met for the National R-PP Review Workshop at the Sri Lanka Foundation Institute in Colombo to discuss the design and submission of the National UN-REDD Programme for Sri Lanka. Participants comprised members of non-governmental organizations and civil society, academic experts, researchers, senior officials from various government agencies, private sector representatives, professionals of the media, members of development partners and donors, among others. We constitute a heterogeneous group with an interest in REDD+ and the proposed REDD+ readiness process in Sri Lanka, and several of us have been consulted during the preparation of the National UN-REDD Programme.

Today we were presented with a brief overview of the R-PP development, progress made since Sri Lanka was invited by the UN-REDD Secretariat to prepare the R-PP, and management arrangements for the implementation of the Programme. We discussed and examined the arrangements and in particular the proposed Outcomes and Outputs.

We endorse the management arrangements and the Programme's outcomes and outputs as proposed in the draft. Several amendments were suggested at Outcome, Output and Activity levels, and the drafting team agreed to include them in the final draft to be submitted to the UN-REDD Policy Board.

The main recommendations for the finalization of the document are as follows:

General Comments

- Need clarification on what is expected by the donor as Log Frame. It should have verifiable indicators and assumptions.
- Decision on the final outcomes (5) should have been done initially before breaking up into groups since they
 are all interconnected.

Under Outcome 3

- Consult and identify a plot location for Free, Prior and Informed Consent (FPIC) and Pilot FPIC and document lessons (linked to Output 5.6) – explain further
- Customized communication should be carried out for communities.
- Request to include "Enhancing capacity of Forest Department conservation centers to hold education programmes on REDD+ by CBOs and NGOs" as a separate activity.

Institutional Arrangements

The Ministry of Environment as a REDD+ focal institution of the Government of Sri Lanka will in due course
identify and coordinate with key government institutions (including the Department of Wildlife Conservation
of the Ministry of Agrarian Services and Wildlife).
