## REQUEST FOR TARGETED SUPPORT<sup>1</sup>

Coordinated approaches for designing and implementing a nationally-appropriate REDD+ Strategy

I. SUMMARY OF REQUEST		
Main objective	The activities included in this request are designed to provide Nepal with a comprehensive set of approaches to designing and implementing a nationally-appropriate REDD+ Strategy.  The request builds on both the work done under the ongoing FPCF programme and the UN-REDD TS activities supported by UNDP in 2013 on identification of drivers and design of REDD+ finance mechanism. When completed, these activities will provide Nepal with a set of methodologies to identify and assess REDD+ strategic options for Policies and Measures, to monitor their implementation and performance, and to link this performance to a national REDD+ finance mechanism.	
Main results expected	Five result areas are envisaged:  1. National REDD+ Strategy options identified which are effective in addressing drivers and causes of deforestation and forest degradation through a cross-sectoral approach (led by UNDP);  2. Potential options for effective, equitable, and transparent management of REDD+ finance assessed (led by UNDP);  3. Methodology to determine the national value of forest ecosystem services and an experimental ecosystems accounts mechanism for forests developed (led by UNEP);  4. Approaches for monitoring the implementation and performance of REDD+ Policies and Measures using proxy

## II. BACKGROUND<sup>2</sup>

The 2012-2013 UN-REDD Targeted Support on drivers of deforestation and forest degradation and REDD+ fund management successfully advanced knowledge and instigated cross-sectoral dialogues on strategy options for addressing drivers of land cover change and potential options for REDD+ fund management at a national level.

The process of dialogue on these two critical issues needs to continue in order to reach consensus on specific REDD+ actions that are socially, economically and environmentally viable, and on REDD+ fund management arrangements that can effectively, efficiently and equitably incentivise the implementation of the REDD+ actions nationally and sub-nationally.

This second proposed phase of Targeted Support will follow directly on from the first phase by addressing the same strategic elements of REDD+ readiness for Nepal. i.e.:

- 1. Increase the effectiveness of National REDD+ Strategy options in addressing drivers and causes of deforestation and forest degradation through a cross-sectoral approach; and
- 2. Increase an understanding of potential options for effective, equitable, and transparent management of REDD+ finance.

It will also address three further elements of REDD+ Readiness as follows:

- 3. Determine the national value of forest ecosystem services and develop an experimental ecosystems accounts mechanism for forests
- 4. Develop and test approaches for monitoring the implementation and performance of REDD+ Policies and Measures using proxy indicators
- 5. Review and analyse Policies, Laws, Regulations (PLR) and institutions in the context of those required for REDD+ implementation, and recommend approaches to fill the identified gaps

The 2014 Targeted Support will directly contribute to addressing critical knowledge and capacity gaps described in the Mid-term Report to the FCPF, in order to complete the National REDD+ Strategy process in Nepal. It is designed as an integrated programme of activities which provides Nepal with a package of approaches for designing and implementing a national REDD+ strategy; from identifying drivers, to identifying strategic options, to performance-based monitoring of these options, and finally linking the indicators used in monitoring to a system for management of REDD+ finance. A PLR and institutional review will provide the basis for a programme of legal preparedness so that Nepal's system of governance is suited for implementation of a REDD+ strategy based on these approaches.

These activities will be designed and monitored by the multi-stakeholder institutions that have already been developed and made operational through the FCPF programme. They will draw on the technical support of all three UN-REDD agencies. A coordinator and support staff will be hired with TS funds, working with and based in the REDD Cell of the Ministry of Forest and Soil Conservation, to manage TS activities on behalf of all three agencies.
