	Deforestation and forest degradation comprise a large proportion (approximately one fifth) of global anthropogenic greenhouse gas emissions. The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) has adopted the REDD+ mechanism in the Cancun agreements. The development is now on its way to provide financial incentives for the reduction of such emissions. REDD+ includes Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation (initially referred to as REDD) as well as: i) conservation of forests; ii) sustainable management of forests; and iii) the enhancement of forest carbon stocks.
	The primary drivers of deforestation and forest degradation need to be addressed in order to ensure the success of National REDD+ programme. In Zambia, these drivers vary across regions and include <i>inter alia</i> : i) charcoal and wood fuel use (for domestic, commercial and industrial uses); ii) timber production; and iii) unsustainable agricultural methods and other land use practices. Drivers of deforestation and forest degradation are a result of a complex set of underlying causes that are primarily caused by past and current development processes. These underlying causes cut across numerous sectors (e.g. energy, forestry, agriculture, land and water). In order to address them and thereby to facilitate the realisation of REDD+, the entire mode of development within Zambia will need to be altered. Both the supply and demand for wood and non-wood forest products will, for example, need to be addressed simultaneously.

Delayed in the implementation of start up activities due to limited capacity: Although there has been an improvement in the delivery of the project the rate is still relatively low. The three staff attached to the programme are still awaiting revised attachment letters that spell out revised TORs facilitating these officers to work 100% on the programme Delay in the establishment of the Steering Committee and Multi-sectoral committee. While a Joint Steering Committee and Technical Committee already exist, there is need to expand the mandate and incorporate other stakeholders that are core to REDD+ implementation. The establishment of steering committee and multi-sectoral committee other stakeholders that have the bearing on the REDD process.  Linkages and coordination among UN-REDD, ILUA, CCFU and ENRMMP: During the Mission visit in May 2011, the Ministry provided a position on how programmes and projects will be implemented in the Ministry in order to enhance coordination, avoid duplication, optimize the different work plans and outcomes and reduce on transactions costs. The Ministry was to come up with a concept paper of integrating these programmes, which has not been presented yet. The delay in developing and implementing the strategy may contribute to the duplication of efforts among the projects.
