VISA & HEALTH CERTIFICATION

Obtaining a visa prior to arrival

A valid passport, not expiring for at least six months, is required for entry into Kenya. A valid entry visa is also required (cost US\$50) and may be obtained in advance from the Kenyan Embassy or High Commission in your country of origin. In the absence of either, the British Embassy will generally represent Kenya in the issuance of visas. Please note: visas are not required by citizens of the Republic of Ireland and the Commonwealth countries (except Antigua, Bermuda, Guyana, India, South Africa, Sri Lanka and the United Kingdom).

Kenyan visas requiring advance clearance

Nationals from the following countries require special advance visa clearance by the Kenyan authorities (as of January 2007): Afghanistan, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Cameroon, Georgia, Islamic Republic of Iran, Iraq, Lebanon, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Jordan, Mali, Nigeria, North Korea, Pakistan, Palestine, Senegal, Somalia, Sudan, Syrian Arab Republic, Tajikistan and Yemen.

Obtaining a visa upon arrival

Visas can also be obtained upon arrival at the airport. The fee is US\$50.

Health certification

A yellow fever vaccination certificate is required ONLY if you are arriving in Kenya from an infected area. For advice on vaccinations recommended for visitors to Kenya, please contact your doctor, or the UNON Medical Clinic at: +254 20 762 2267 and/or the emergency line at: +254 20 762 5999.


TRANSPORTATION

Security at UNON

GENERAL INFORMATION

Climate

The coast is hot with an average daytime temperature of 27-31 degrees centigrade whilst the average daytime temperature in Nairobi is 21-26 degrees centigrade. Typically **March-May is the wet season**.

Currency exchange

Most hotels offer forex facilities, though sometimes at disadvantageous rates. Forex facilities remain open at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport daily from 7am to midnight.

Currency

Kenya shilling (Ksh); slang 'bob'; coins: 50cts, KSh1, KSh5, KSh10 and KSh20; notes KSh50, KSh100, KSh200, KSh500 and KSh1, 000.

Exchange rates

As a general guide to exchange rates, the following rates apply as of March 2009: 1 US\$ = 90 Kenya shillings; 1 Euro = 109 Kenya shillings; and 1 Pound Sterling = 116 Kenya shillings.

Banking

Foreign currency can be changed at banks, foreign currency bureau or hotels. Banks in major centers are open from 09.00 to 15.00 Mon-Fri. 09.00 to 11.00 on the first and last Saturday of each month. Banks in coastal towns open and close half an hour earlier.

- 1) ATMs are available country wide with 24-hour access. Most accept international VISA cards
- 2) All major international credit cards are accepted
- 3) Traveler's cheques are accepted at most banks, bureau and hotels

Water

Kenyan tap water is not safe to drink. Bottled water is readily available.

International country code: + 254 (Kenya) and city area code: 20 (Nairobi).


Time


GMT +3 all year-round. Kenya maintains an almost constant 12 hours of daylight. Sunrise is typically 06.30 and sunset at 18.45.
