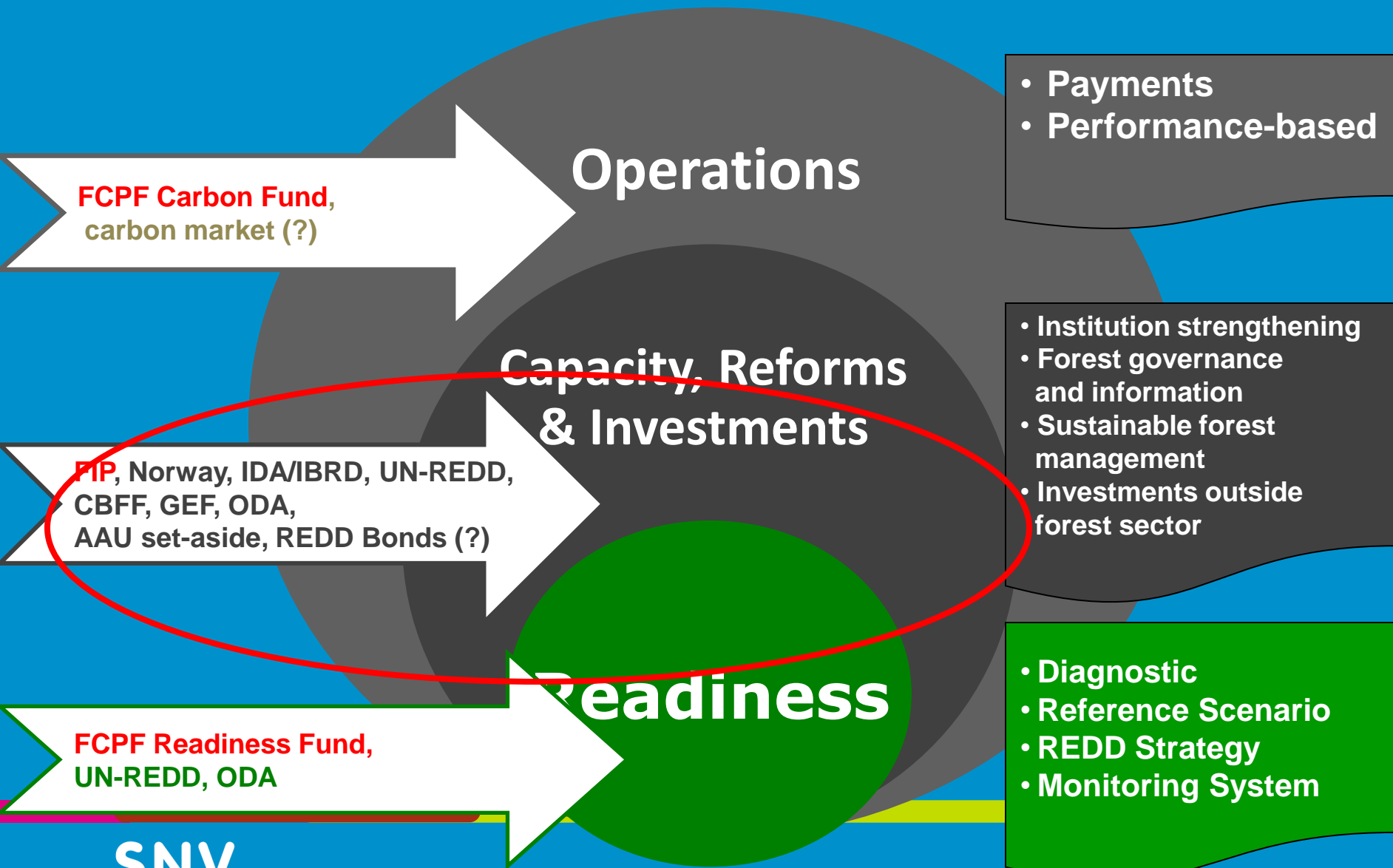

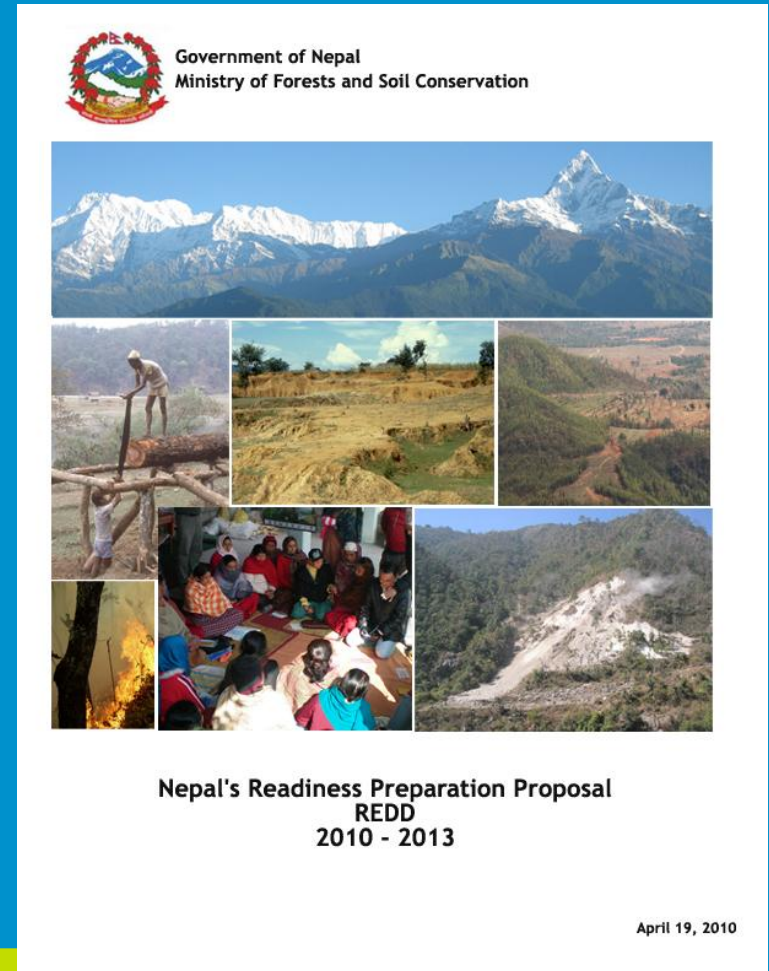

[II] The Readiness Preparation Proposal (RPP)

- Provides a framework for taking stock of the national situation from the point of view of deforestation and forest degradation and sets out clear strategic interventions to address the situation
- Limited to early planning, mostly analytical work and system design

RPP Process in Viet Nam

- Viet Nam was one of the first countries to receive approval for its Readiness Plan Idea Note (R-PIN) under the World Bank's Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF)
- Readiness Preparation Proposal (R-PP) has been submitted and been approved. Requesting approximately \$3.6 million to directly support REDD+ preparation and implementation

- Led by Directorate of Forestry
- World Bank Team/DoF requested a number of consultancies to provide input for the RPP (i) drivers of deforestation study and (ii) SESA and consultation plan
- UN REDD designated to help pull document together
- Collaborative effort DoF, World Bank Team, UNREDD and FAO

- It became clear the advantages of different organisations; also UN REDD Phase I provided parts of info
- *World Bank*: drivers, policy reform, forest governance, SESA etc
- *UNREDD*: benefit distribution mechanism *FAO*: MRV etc
- Chapters divided up, filled out, pulled together by group, led by DOF, UN REDD
- Viewed by WB as example of close collaboration between UNREDD and FCPF RPP

[III] Mainstreaming RPP with UN REDD

- The RPP template gone through many iterations. Agreed template to assess and decide on steps towards readiness
- Clear logic building from the assessment of drivers of deforestation
- RPP should offer Common Framework agreed by all groups

- UN REDD, WB decide on *roles and responsibilities* as highlighted under the RPP
- Different orgs different strengths [e.g. WB - forest governance, Carbon Funds, SESA etc]
- No cookie cutter approach; *country by country approach*

- Should be *one overall lead agency* (exploring multi delivery partners (discussed at PC7) UN REDD in Cambodia; UN REDD in Viet Nam
 - Key criteria lead agency ongoing REDD commitment/investment (e.g. VN UN REDD, Laos and Indonesia FIP)
 - Past experience in country, particularly forest sector

- Determine what support each can provide
- Also gaps and pro active efforts each could fill (e.g. Carbon Fund, attracting investment, links UN FCCC)
- Integrated work-plans and budgets activities are jointly presented and monitored



- Need for FCPF/UN REDD lessons learning and info sharing, joint workshops
- Also assist in work areas such as regional displacement
- Experiences in Viet Nam shown efforts at country level can help advance greater collaboration. Opportunity to build on this
