WWF-Indonesia has more than 30 years experience carrying out conservation activities involving local and indigenous communities as well as in collaboration with other local actors (including local government) so that the lessons-learned can be incorporated further into local policies. There are now 21 field works in 19 provinces in Indonesia ranging from the western part in Aceh to the eastern part in Papua. The range of works includes field based community conservation activities, community based sustainable forest management and non-timber forest production, payment for environmental services, and community mapping.

WWF-Indonesia has been acknowledged and incorporated as part of Indonesia Forest and Climate Alliance (an alliance on REDD readiness consists of governments, donor agencies, NGOs, and other international institutions led by the Ministry of Forestry supported by the World Bank and other donors).
