These meetings brought together approximately 30 Districts with stakeholders from the agriculture, energy, forestry, planning sectors plus civil society; A stakeholder consultation workshop on the 'Economic valuation study on the role of forests and related ecosystem services to Zambian economy' took place in March 2014. This provided an opportunity to present the validity of conducting such an analysis to the design of a successful National REDD+ Strategy as well as to long-term national economic planning and development. Participants provided positive feedback on the event. The preliminary findings of the study were presented to the Government and national stakeholders during a consultation meeting on the Issues & Options paper that will inform the National REDD+ Strategy and equally received positively. A consolidated draft of the study was in route of completion in June 2014 and a final version is expected in the fourth quarter of 2014.

2. National Programme Progress

2.1 Narrative on Progress, Difficulties and Contingency Measures

2.1.1 Please provide a brief overall assessment of the extent to which the National Programme is progressing in relation to expected outcomes and outputs and the opportunities and challenges. Please provide examples if relevant (300 words).

Building on the recommendations of the Strategic Review conducted in 2013, the National Programme implementation in Zambia has demonstrated rapid progresses in the first half of 2014. The biggest achievement of the first half of 2014 is the advancement of the Issues and Options Paper (the I&O Paper), which serves as the embryo for furthering national REDD+ strategy development process in Zambia.

The Paper builds on the compilation of the wide range of analytical works related to REDD+ conducted thus far, including the ones conducted under the UN-REDD National Programme, and builds on the gaps and potential of REDD+ identified throughout the process. The I&O Paper also incorporates gender element, and captures broad range of REDD+ dimensions (including, inter alia, policy, legal, regulatory framework, governance, finance and incentives, safeguards and grievance, institutions, stakeholder engagement and incorporation of REL/RL).

Drafting of the I&O paper was accompanied by the technical advisory workshop held in April 2014. The session was participated by the national REDD+ focal point and his team, UN-REDD agencies, international donors and CSOs. The session also updated work plan for the National Programme until the end of the no-cost extension period. The compilation of studies and advancement with the I&O paper moves Zambia forward for the next step towards national REDD+ process, which is series of multi-stakeholder consultations ranging from high-level political dialogue to community consultations, and national arbitration of strategy options and validation of the strategy which are all forthcoming in the second half of 2014.

The observed challenge is that the preparation and consolidation of Issues and Options Paper is taking slightly longer than originally expected, due to complex nature of the task to extract the essence of different technical work streams and analyses to be embedded into a single consolidated report. While the National Programme is advancing well, this brings the issue of feasibility of ultimate delivery of national REDD+ strategy by December, the end of the no-cost extension period of the Programme. Managerial consultation of the UN-REDD might be needed to consider the direction.

2.1.2 Please provide a brief overall assessment of any measures taken to ensure the sustainability of the National Programme results during the reporting period. Please provide examples if relevant. (200 words)

The preparatory process of the Issues and Options paper was guided by the strategic technical workshop organized among the National REDD+ Coordination Unit with national REDD+ focal point, UN-REDD agencies, CSOs and the team of consultants with resource persons. This setting demonstrated a good practice of ensuring quality of the work, as well as demonstration of a good team spirit guided by the Chaminuka Protocol.

Other relevant work technical streams, including RL/REL workshop, was also attended by different stakeholders and information shared among the UN-REDD agencies which also demonstrates the National Programme in Zambia is well guided by the Deliver-as-One principle.
